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Weatherly Chosen To Defend Title Against Australia

Newport, R. I. —UPI— Weatherly was picked Saturday night to defend the America's Cup against Australia's Gretel next month.

Commodore Henry S. Morgan, chairman of the New York Yacht club selection committee, announced the United States representative for this year's Classic yacht series after Weatherly defeated Neferitti for the third consecutive time in the final trials earlier Saturday.

The selection committee had until Sept. 8 to choose between Weatherly and Neferitti, but Weatherly was so impressive in the first three races of the final trials that the committee decided to wait no longer.

The cup races between Weatherly and Gretel will begin off Newport Sept. 15.

Weatherly won Saturday's test against Neferitti by a margin of five minutes and 29 seconds.

Once again light air was Neferitti's undoing, this time southwest winds of 8 to 12 knots.

With 34-year-old sailmaker-designer Ted Hood at the tiller, the queen edged into a small lead at the start of the 24-mile, twice-around, windward-leeward course, but she retained the lead only briefly.

The blue-hulled Weatherly began slowly to creep away from Neferitti, gliding by her just before she reached the first mark to post a margin of 1 minute, 54 seconds.

Weatherly added 14 seconds on the second leg to chalk up a 2-minute, 8-second advantage at the halfway point. At the third turn, Weatherly had piled it on to lead by 3 minutes, 51 seconds.

With the race all but won, Weatherly then proceeded to outdo Neferitti on a broad reach to the finish line to post the 3-minute, 29-second margin.

Broncos' Gene Mingo Boots Winning Goal For Win Over Texans

The Denver Broncos and the Dallas Texans, doormats of the American Football league since its inception two years ago, played like it was the playoffs Friday night with the Broncos' Gene Mingo providing the heroics.

Mingo, who never attended college but received a pro tryout by writing a letter in 1960, booted a 17-yard field goal to give Denver a 27-24 sudden death overtime victory over Dallas in an exhibition game at Fort Worth, Tex.

The 23-year-old Mingo, who led the NFL in scoring in his rookie year, caught the tying touchdown pass for the Broncos in addition to kicking two field goals and three extra points.

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Leo Durocher Leaves Hospital Shaken But OK

New York —UPI— Los Angeles Dodgers coach Leo Durocher walked out of Roosevelt hospital Saturday, still shaken by a violent reaction to a penicillin injection that almost cost him his life.

The 57-year-old former manager of the Brooklyn Dodgers and New York Giants collapsed in the Los Angeles club house at the Polo Grounds Friday night about two hours before a game between the Dodgers and New York Mets.

After emergency treatment by Dr. Ward Hastings in the Polo Grounds, Leo was rushed to the hospital in an ambulance for precautionary measures. Officials at the hospital said that he was out of danger.

Durocher was in front of his stall in the clubhouse Friday night when he suddenly collapsed and fell to the floor. Only moments earlier he had complained to Leo Scott, the Dodgers' traveling secretary, that he felt ill, and this was about 15 minutes after he had taken a penicillin injection for an infection.
