

Judge Says Pirates Can't Stage Walkout

St. Louis —(UPI)— Judge Robert Cannon of Milwaukee, major league players' advisor, told members of the Pittsburgh Pirates Saturday that they have no legal right to stage a walkout because of a stepped-up playing schedule.

The Pirates were reported to have threatened a walkout because they were forced to play a day-night doubleheader Saturday and an afternoon twin bill today. A rain-out game here Friday resulted in Saturday's afternoon - night doubleheader.

Cannon said Saturday morning that the games will be played as planned.

Legislative Committee Hears of Boat Toilets, Pollution Problems

Portland —(UPI)— The Oregon Legislative Interim committee on natural resources was told Friday that large pleasure boats equipped with flush toilets were starting to create pollution problems in the state's inland lakes.

The testimony was made by Lawrence Barber and Robert Rittenhouse of Portland, representing the State Marine board, at the opening session of a two-day hearing.

Barber and Rittenhouse told the committee that legislation was needed to require that boats operating on lakes with such facilities either plug them up or equip them with sanitation devices allowing sanitary sewage disposal.

They noted that Diamond Lake recently was closed to boats with marine toilets because of pollution problems.

Harry Jerome Equals Record In 100 Dash

Vancouver, B. C. —(UPI)— Harry Jerome of North Vancouver, B. C., equalled the world's record of 9.2 seconds for the 100-yard dash at Empire stadium Saturday, making him an even stronger favorite to win a gold medal for Canada at the British Empire Games in November.

Three of the four judges at the track meet before only about 300 spectators gave the 22-year-old sprinter the world record time, while the fourth gave him 9.1 seconds.

Jerome tied the world mark running with a slight tail wind which was under the maximum velocity allowed.

Only two other men had ever run this fast. They were Frank Budd of Villanova, now a professional football player, and Bob Hayes of Florida State.

Jerome already shares the 100-meter world record of 10 seconds with retired German sprinter Armin Hary.

SWIM RECORD SET

Los Altos, Calif. —(UPI)— Sharon Finerman of Los Angeles broke her own world record in the women's 200-meter butterfly with a time of 2:30.9 and Australia's Murray Rose tied the world's 200-meter men's freestyle record Saturday in the far western swimming championships. Miss Finerman's previous world record was 2:31.2 set last week in the National AAU swimming and diving championships at Chicago. Both she and Rose are affiliated with the Los Angeles Athletic club. Rose tied the world mark of 2:00.4, set earlier this year by Don Schollander of Santa Clara, Calif.

Stratford, Conn. —(UPI)— Defending champion Whittier, Calif., defeated Minneapolis 1-0 and Stratford beat Elizabeth, N. J., 2-0, Friday night in the women's world softball tournament here.

NEW RECORD SET
Orange, Mass. —(UPI)— A Bulgarian parachutist landed dead center on the target Saturday to set a new record and take the lead in a men's accuracy event at the sixth world sport parachute championships. Georgui Galabov's dead center landing was the fifth made so far at the championships. But it was the first recorded time that a parachutist has come down on target center in a jump from 4,400 feet with a 10 to 15 second delay before opening his parachute.

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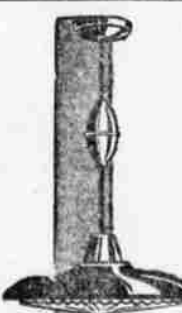
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
