JACK CHISHOLM EARLL
A former pilot for Mercy Flights, Inc., Jack Chisholm Earll, 45, of 515 Boardman st., Medford, died at a local hospital Tuesday night.
Mr. Earll moved to the Medford area from Seattle in 1959 and had been with Mercy Flights up to the time of his death. Until recently he also had flown borate planes for local aviation agencies. He had been intermittently ill for some time, according to associates.
He served in the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard as a pilot in both the Korean Conflict and World War II.
He is survived by his wife. Funeral arrangements will be announced by Conger Morris Funeral directors of Medford.

Registration Set In School in GH

Gold Hill—Registration for first graders will be held at Patrick school Friday, Aug. 31, from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m., according to Gilbert Mack, principal of Gold Hill schools.
Only children who will be 6 by Nov. 15 will be enrolled. Parents have been reminded to bring the child's birth certificate. First grade teachers, Mrs. Barbara Toner and Mrs. Wilda Franks, will be in charge of registration in rooms 3 and 4.
There is a workbook fee of \$1 and insurance may be purchased for \$2.50. This covers the child against injuries to and from school and during school hours. The principal suggested that the charges be taken care of at registration time.
Milk is served first and second graders in the afternoon. The school prefers to collect this cost, \$8.75 for the year, on registration day. Lunches at \$1.25 a week also are payable in advance.
