Factors Told For Freeway Driving In Largest State

Los Angeles - (UPI) - Better drivers, safer automobiles, fear of citations and highway engineering have been combined to make California freeway driving three times as safe as driving on a city street.

This figure is based on files kept by the Los Angeles Police department and substantiated by the California Highway patrol.

The records list some of the reasons why freeway driving is safer than non-freeway driving.

The majority of freeway drivers have become "defensive drivers," they not only watch their own operations but they watch others near them.

Most freeway drivers keep within their lanes and only change when it is safe to do. They carefully work their way to the right before leaving a freeway.

Because freeway driving is normally high-speed driving most drivers won't go on a freeway if their cars are not reasonably well maintained.

Violations Expensive

Most drivers realize that Los Angeles freeways are well patrolled and that citations for moving violations in California are expensive.

Also, highway engineers are waging a never-ending battle to make freeways safer. They are concentrating on the ever-dangerous head-on collision.

When the first freeways were built the engineers recommended that roses be planted in the dividing strip to keep headlights glare out of the eyes of approaching drivers.

Now a new approach to this problem has been taken. The partially-completed Santa Monica freeway - linking downtown Los Angeles with Santa Monica - will have Al-synite translucent plastic paneling on top of a concrete divider.

This plastic paneling, long associated with the building industry, has been improved for highway use.

State highway engineer F. N. Hveem said the plastic for highway use must be sufficiently opaque to completely dim oncoming high-beam headlights, must be able to withstand the weather and high winds and must have a low gloss to prevent sun-glare.

Sophia Loren Named Most Beautiful Woman by Group

New York - (UPI) - Sophia Loren was picked as the most beautiful woman in the world today by the Caricaturists Society of America. Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy placed fourth, behind Brigitte Bardot and Grace Kelly.

The caricaturists society is a group of artists which feel that a woman with a beautiful face does not necessarily need a figure to match, although it helps.

Joseph Kaliff, president of the group, said a woman's beauty "has to be in her face, rather than in her legs or arms... or any other part of her figure."

"It's entirely possible for a woman with a beautiful face to also have a beautiful figure. But it's rare that a caricaturist bothers to notice anything about a beautiful woman except her face."

Here is the list of the artist's 10 most beautiful women and why they were selected:

Sophia Loren - "In addition to everything else, she has what must be the most beautiful eyes in the world."

Brigitte Bardot - "First, you see her arresting chin, then you notice the rest of her face is equally irresistible."

Grace Kelly - "If ever a woman has more perfect ears, we've yet to meet her."

Jacqueline Kennedy - "Her magnificent head of hair must be a hairdresser's delight. It supplies a frame for a magnificent face."

Audrey Hepburn - "Her neck is so fragile, so lovely."

Julia Meade - "Hers is a perfectly shaped, delicate nose."

Shirley Maclaine - "Her lips are the most inviting any artist could ever recall ever seeing."

Kim Novak - "She has perfect cheekbone structure."

Princess Margaret - "She has a classically beautiful forehead, from which the rest of a most beautiful face flows."

Doris Day - "Whoever said freckles detract from beauty didn't see Doris. Every woman should have her freckles and facial beauty."

Two Independents Run for Governor

Salem - (UPI) - Oregon voters apparently will have two independent candidates on the November general election ballot, both running for governor.

The deadline for independent filing passed Tuesday.

Sec. of State Howell Appling Jr. received petitions from Donald Bellinger of Salem and Robert Sampler of Oregon City.

However, Appling has asked Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton for an opinion on the legality of the convention which nominated Bellinger.

The meeting stayed open for five days.

Leslie Fleming of Springfield, who was nominated for the U. S. Senate by the same convention, wired Appling of his withdrawal.

A fourth hopeful, Dan Metheny of Brooks, attempted to file for the Senate, but State Elections Director Jack F. Thompson said his papers were not in order.

Chest X-Ray Clinic Open on Thursday
