

Oregon State To Start 95th Year; 10,000 Expected

Corvallis — Oregon State university will begin its 95th academic year this month with a record enrollment of almost 10,000 forecast.

Fall term classes will begin Sept. 24, but new student programs will get under way a week earlier and fraternity and sorority rush programs will be held early to avoid conflict with classes.

Opening general assembly for all new freshmen and transfer students is scheduled Sept. 19. Registration will be Sept. 20 and 21 with the first football game of the year scheduled Sept. 22 against Iowa State at Portland. Faculty Day, which officially launches the new school year for the staff, will be Sept. 11.

OSU's enrollment last fall soared to 9,039, 1,100 students more than ever before. Admission totals and housing requests point to the nearly 10,000 total this year.

Record Enrollment Seen
Along with a record enrollment, students will find the greatest building year in OSU history under way, President James H. Jensen noted.

A new 325-bed dormitory was completed in August and will help ease housing problems; another new 375-bed dormitory and cafeteria have been started for completion next fall; and the new \$2,385,000 library is in early stages of construction. A new Oceanography building, radiation center, and computer center are expected to be started during the school year.

A new forestry sciences laboratory operated by the U.S. forest service was dedicated last month on the OSU campus.

Two new deans have been appointed during the summer. They are Dr. Vernon H. Chel-delin, school of science, and Dr. Edmund Volkart, school of humanities and social sciences.

This fall, ROTC training will become voluntary for freshmen and sophomore men. It had been required in the past.

Housing is expected to be "tight" but ample, university officials said.
