Alley Paving Work Approved by Council

The Medford city council last night approved several items with only one councilman voting no on one request.

Donald Hansen, councilman for Ward 2, opposed paving an alley in block 46, original town. A public hearing on the request was held.

Hansen felt that a majority of property owners representing a majority of the alley frontage should be in favor of paving since an alley is used little by the public.

It was pointed out that the property on both sides of the alley is zoned commercial.

Sign Petitions
 Council President Stan Stark, who presided at the session in the absence of Mayor John W. Snider, pointed out that three of the seven property owners along the alley have signed petitions favoring the paving and three have expressed opposition to the project. The property owners who petitioned for the paving represent 58.3 per cent of the frontage.

City Engineer Vern Thorpe said the alley now needs patching and has created a drainage problem for businesses on one side of the alley.

Also approved was a request to annex to the city property lying east of Murphy rd. and south of Country club dr. The property is part of a proposed subdivision and would be accessible to both city water and sewer systems.

Other Council Action
 In other action the city council approved:
 —Segregation of assessments on property divided after the original assessment was made;

—A grant agreement with the U.S. government for installation of a remotely controlled wind tee, segmented circle and wind cone and construction of an apron and taxiway extension to the municipal airport jointly with the Federal Aviation Agency;

—Plans and specifications for curb and gutter locations and grade line on Edwards st. between Beatty and Niantic sts.

—A call for bids for paving the alley in block 46, original town;

—Authorization of plans and specifications for paving Hillcrest rd. from Valley View to Black Oak dr.; and
 —The acceptance of the East Jackson st. project from Crater Lake ave. to Marie st.

Liquor Commission Moves to Location On North Grape St.

The Medford store maintained by the Oregon State Liquor Control commission has moved from 118 South Central ave. to 148 North Grape st.

The move, which took place over the Labor day week end, was made because of a lack of storage and parking space at the old location, according to Roger F. Taylor, manager of the store.

The new site provides increased storage and display space, as well as parking facilities. In addition, the store will now be able to ship merchandise to outlying areas.

With the move, the store has been converted to a self-service establishment, the first in southern Oregon. Three check-out stands, each equipped with price lists, will serve the customer after he makes his selection.

Contracts Awarded For Paving

Contracts were awarded by the Medford city council last night for a storm sewer, a paving project, and two projects at the airport.

Prior to the awarding of contracts, the council pre-qualified Trowbridge and Flynn Electric company, Streck Electric company, F. L. Somers, all Medford, and Madison and Stoke, Roseburg, for construction work for the city.

A fifth firm, Enloe Electric, Medford, was rejected since it failed to certify the statement submitted to the city. The council recommended that the statement be returned to the company, stating the reasons, and asking them to re-submit it.

Awarded Contract

Tru-Mix Concrete and Equipment company was awarded a contract to construct and pave a 6,446-square-yard addition to the ramp and a 600-foot long taxiway at the airport. The project, to cost \$28,455.60, is part of the federal aid airport program. Two firms bid on the project.
