Another Russian Explosion Reported

Uppsala, Sweden (UPI)—The Soviet Union detonated a nine-megaton nuclear device in the atmosphere in the Novaya Zemlya area in the Arctic today, the Uppsala Seismographic Institute announced.
The blast was the 12th reported by the institute in the current nuclear test series in the Soviet Union. These figures apparently refer only to tests at Novaya Zemlya. The U.S. Atomic Energy Commission has disclosed two others, at Semipalatinsk in central Siberia, for a total of 14, and said there have been additional explosions which it has not announced.

Two Indicted on Assault Charges

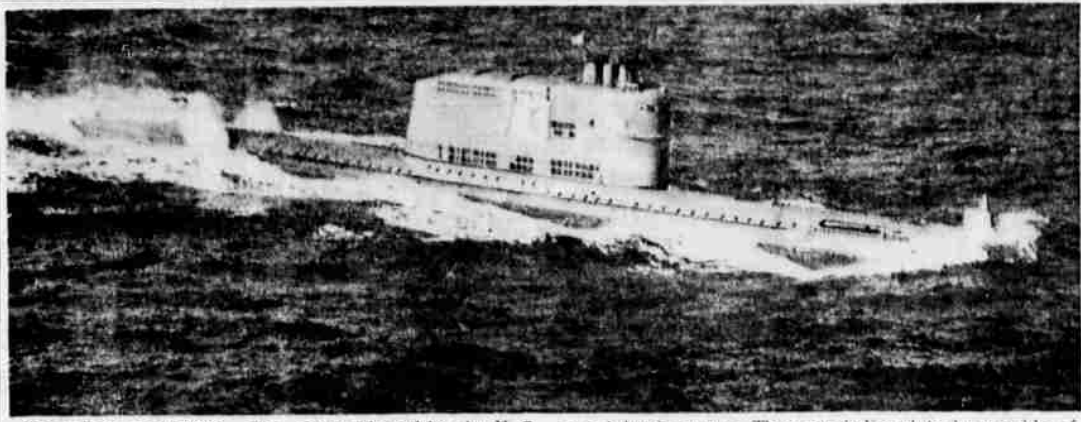
Vale, Ore. (UPI)—Two men held in Malheur county jail here were indicted Thursday by the county grand jury on charges of assault with intent to kill the Ontario police chief.
Stanley D. Rose, 22, Seattle, and Donald A. Hibbard, 23, Vancouver, Wash., were being held in lieu of \$10,000 bail and were to appear in court today to answer the charges.
Rose and Hibbard, suspected of taking part in a \$5,000 market robbery in Boise, Idaho, last Saturday night, were charged with shooting at Chief Jim Jones when he attempted to stop them at a roadblock shortly after the robbery.

Higher Medals Urged for Men Who Withstand Torture as Prisoners

Washington (UPI)—The Army is being strongly urged to grant higher military decorations to men who withstand communist torture after being taken prisoners.
The decorations could include the coveted Medal of Honor if congress approves a newly submitted defense department request for authority to grant the nation's highest military award for heroism in peacetime.

The drive for greater recognition stems partly from the fact that survivors of Maj. Walter H. Moon received only the Bronze Star medal in his behalf, although his courage as a communist prisoner in Laos was described officially as "an incredible story of heroism."
Similar awards were made to Maj. Lawrence R. Bailey and Sgt. Orville Ballenger when they were flown home recently from Laos after resisting all attempts to break their will while prisoners. Bailey was kept a full year in solitary confinement in pitch-black darkness.

Under the heading "Have U.S. armed forces forgotten how to honor great heroism?" the Army-Navy-Air Force Journal and Register pointed out that the Bronze Star is "for meritorious service," below the Distinguished Service Medal in the same category.
"There is good reason for many members of the armed forces to wonder why Maj. Moon's deed should not have received higher commendation," the service journal said.
Moon, 38, of Rudy, Ark., was killed in a second escape attempt after enduring four months of torture at the hands of the Communist Patet Lao. Like Ballenger, he was serving as an adviser to the Royal Laotian Army when captured in April, 1961.
The official account said "efforts to break him mentally and physically were constant. Interrogation followed interrogation. Beatings, kicks from guards, bindings of his arms and constant threats in addition to the physical torture

President Ivan Smalley of Eugene announced that major plans will be discussed for the 1962-63 season. Members will hear a report of the society's national convention.

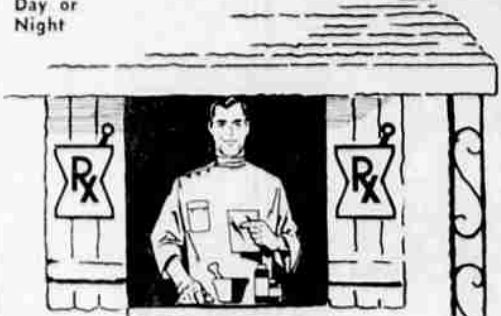
Carl Hazencamp will report on plans for the Oregon Tax Conference Nov. 15-17 at the Memorial Coliseum in Portland.
