

FAMILY COUNCIL

Charlotte H. — For weeks he's been saying "Ella" in his sleep.

Gordon H. — How can I be held responsible for what I say while asleep?

Charlotte H. — I'm 26, considered beautiful, and hold a responsible job in a textile firm. I've been married three years. My husband is a drowsy buyer. We're completely compatible and in love with each other — at least I am. Lately I'm not so sure about him, because in the past few weeks he's been mentioning an "Ella" in his sleep.
