

More People Seek Home Information Through Chamber

People seeking residential information about Medford continue to outnumber those requesting tourist information, according to an analysis of letters received by the Medford Chamber of Commerce.

Don McNeil, manager of the chamber, said the chamber receives more than 3,000 letters a year requesting a wide variety of information. The analysis of letters was made during the last five months to determine the category of information most commonly sought, McNeil said.

"We were surprised to learn," he said, "that one third of all letters coming to the chamber specifically indicate a desire or plans to move to Medford and request information in this category. Seventeen per cent of the letters requested tourist information."

More requests for tourist information is received as a direct result of advertising in newspapers and publications, he noted.

Request Pattern Changes
"Ten years ago," he noted, "we received more requests from prospective tourists than prospective residents. At that time we saw the need to develop more concise information for those wanting to come here and live because it was evident that the request pattern was changing."

McNeil said the more concise information program has paid off "because Medford seems to be highly regarded as one of the top chambers when it comes to presenting facts to the residential prospect."

"This we are told by many who have come here to live and have had occasion to write numerous chambers of commerce," he added.

Other types of information sought includes inquiries from school children, 15 per cent; inquiries for general information, 19 per cent, and miscellaneous inquiries, 17 per cent.

The latter, McNeil said, may range from a request for a Medford postcard for some collector to a yellow page listing of all dental laboratories.

Some of the mail received reflects weather conditions in other parts of the country, McNeil said.

"For example, severe snow storms in North Dakota will invariably bring a flock of letters from that area asking for facts about Medford and particularly weather information. Tornadoes across Texas will immediately produce a flood of mail from that state seeking similar information," he noted.
