

Ashland Club Meets; Anniversary Tea Set October 8

Ashland — Although Mrs. Walter Redford and Mrs. Harry Skerry claimed no collusion they both chose for last Monday's program at Ashland Study club subjects concerning India.

Mrs. Redford reviewed a translated Indian novel, "Chammee," which follows the life of a young Indian girl, daughter of fisherfolk along

the southwest coast of India. It is one of the works selected by UNESCO.

The story seems an unbelievable one to American readers, who cannot comprehend the strange customs of the caste system or the extreme poverty in which this 10-year-old child's love and marriage develop. The author displays vivid descriptive abil-

ity and paints the exotic surroundings with telling effect. In the tragic climax when a monsoon engulfs the young husband and is cause for a suicide drowning of his wife and her childhood lover, the novel reaches a dramatic apex.

Also on an Indian subject was the half-hour discussion by Mrs. Skerry. From a re-

cent number of the Rotarian magazine she gave excerpts on the life and works of Sir Rabindranath Tagore, writer, philosopher, painter and Nobel prize winner, whose centennial anniversary was celebrated in 1961.

She told much of his peace efforts in bridging the east and the west and of his famed "Retreat of Peace"—a coeducational school that became one of India's most influential institutions. He ignored caste and superstition to win the title of "India's Universal Man."

During the business session conducted by Mrs. R. Drew Lamb, plans were made for the 60th anniversary tea which the club will hold October 8 in Trinity parish house. The guests are to be members of Fortnightly Study club of Ashland and the Medford Study club. The program is to begin at 1:30 p.m.
