JFK Signs Bill To Permit Appeals
 Washington—(AP)—President Kennedy has signed a bill which will enable appeals from administrative decisions by the Bureau of Land Management, the U. S. Forest Service and Bureau of Mines to be heard in local federal courts.
 Under the old law, the only way to appeal decisions was by suing the Secretary of Agriculture or Secretary of the Interior in Washington.
