Ashland - Richard Reynen, 234 Ridge road, combined business and pleasure on a trip to New York which included one of the World Series games played in San Francisco.

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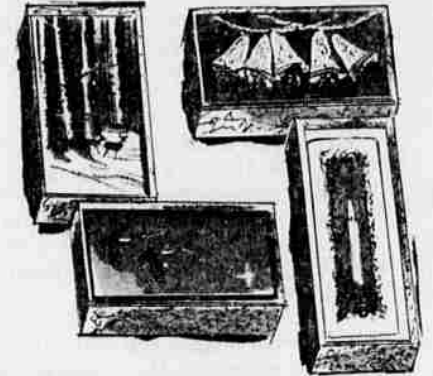
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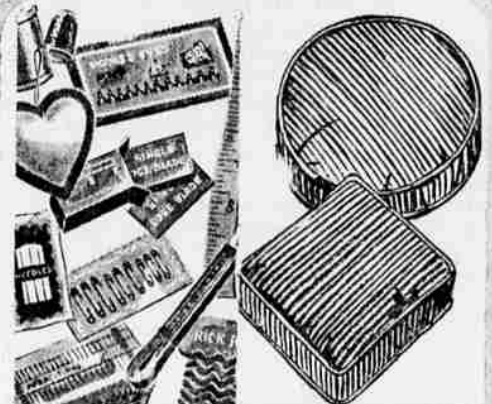
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
