Gene Mingo Leads Broncs To Victory

A spectacular scoring duel shapes up next Sunday when Gene Mingo, the Denver Broncs' point-making machine, pits his versatility against the passing of the Houston Oilers George Blanda in a clash of the American Football league's division leaders.

Blanda, whose play had been spotty in earlier games this season, threw six touchdowns passes Sunday as the Oilers set an AFL scoring record by beating the New York Titans, 56-17.

Mingo, the 200-pound half-back who never went to college, scored 17 points in leading the Denver Broncs to a 23-6 victory over the Oakland Raiders. Mingo now has kicked 15 field goals and scored 83 points in six games.

Both the University of Oregon and Oregon State university have expressed a keen desire to schedule a game annually at Medford because of southern Oregon's strong interest in football and because of the fact this area has been a provider of grid material for both schools.

Proceeds of the game will go to the children's dental clinic and to the Medford high school athletic department. The 50 per cent net proceed portion going to the high school will be used for dressing room construction under the new grandstand.

The ticket locations are Hubbard Brothers hardware, Baker's men's store, Mann's Department store, First National bank, Drew's Manstore and the Big Y market, all in Medford, and the Central Point pharmacy. Members of the Kiwanis club also have tickets.

All seats for the game will be sold on a general admission basis with the exception that high school season ticket holders who have seats in the new grandstand on a five year basis may purchase tickets for their regular seats. They may buy tickets from the foregoing ticket locations and exchange them at Lampori's Sporting Goods store or they may obtain the tickets directly at Lampori's. They have through Wednesday, Oct. 24, to reserve their five-year seats.
