## Cost of Enforcing Enrollment Of Meredith Passes \$1 Million

Washington - (AP) - Additional military costs of more than \$1 million have been incurred so far in enforcing the enrollment of James Meredith at the University of Mississippi, according to estimates by defense officials. But they are hoping that the final figure will be substantially less than the \$4.9 million spent when troops were used in the school integration dispute at Little Rock, Ark., in 1957. They are sure it will be far less than the \$150 million spent in sending troops to Lebanon in 1958. No comprehensive attempt has yet been made to deter-

mine the Mississippi costs. But a rough idea can be obtained from the number of man-days involved in moving 20,000 regular troops and 3,000 national guardsmen into the Oxford, Miss., area. All but 4,800 of these troops now have been moved out, so the daily cost has shrunk to approximately a fifth of the peak reached soon after the first of them were ordered to the scene Sept. 30. The troop expenses now appear to be the only cost of consequence likely to be borne by the Defense department. The Army said no claims for damages in the rioting on the campus have yet been forwarded to Army headquarters, and that only minor claims are being processed by the local command. The Justice department, however, has incurred substantial non-military costs in sending 500 U.S. marshals to Oxford. **\$12 Per Day Per Man** For the Mississippi national guardsmen, who would otherwise be in civilian life, the additional expense is probably close to \$12 per day per man, officials said. For the regulars, who would be drawing pay, allowances and subsistence in any case, the additional expense

may be calculated at only \$5 or less per man per day. At the Pentagon, this is a familiar line of figuring, because it is used in dividing with the West German government the additional expense of maintaining 6,000 U.S. troops in West Berlin. **Berlin Costs Computed** For the year ended July 1, the additional Berlin costs were computed at only \$15.7 million, of which the Bonn government paid 93 per cent. However, this did not include the pay of the troops or other large outlays which help boost the U.S. military budget close to \$50 billion a year. The per-man basis would in-

dicating continuing costs of more than \$30,000 a day in Mississippi - approximately \$14,000 for the 1,200 guardsmen still at Oxford, \$16,500 for the 3,300 regulars still on the campus and perhaps \$1,500 for the 300 support troops still in Memphis, Tenn. At the peak, the figure was probably closer to \$150,000 a day, with an average somewhere near \$100,000 to be expected for the first ten days, officials said.

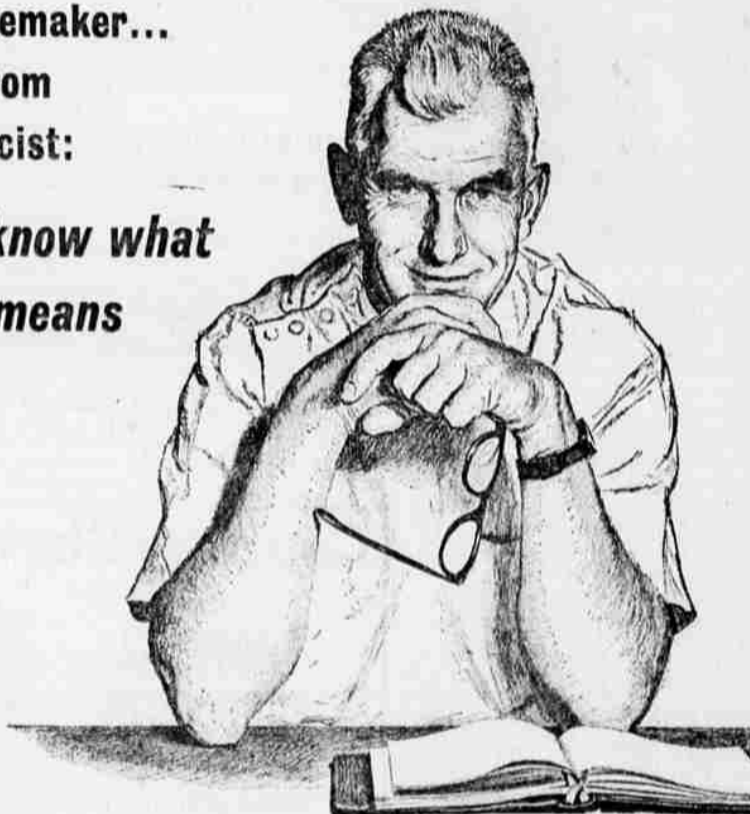
