Failure To Obtain Prisoner Releases Rapped by Floridan

Washington (UPI)—Rep. William C. Cramer (R-Fla.) has blasted the Kennedy administration for "letting American prisoners rot in jails around the world," including Cuba.

Cramer said that at the same time, the administration was "backing" the Cuban prisoner ransom "blackmail deal."

Cramer said in a statement: "Compassion for Cuban prisoners, as for American prisoners, is the policy of the New Frontier."

Cramer said he has been informed that 21 Americans were in Cuban prisons, "largely on bogus charges, and many are in ill health, being mistreated, and are underfed, but we hear little of efforts to get them out of prison."

He said four Americans were in Red China prisons, one in Russia and four unaccounted for in North Korea. "Our attitude about American prisoners rotting in Cuba's jails seems to be that nothing can be done for them short of efforts to free Cuba from Castro and Communism," Cramer said.

"But our attitude about Cuban prisoners is that we must give in to Castro's ransom and indemnity demands and provide him with much-needed dollars, foodstuffs and

medicine—all of which he can trade off for more war material to be used against us."

Cramer said the State department refused to give the names of the 21 Americans in Cuba, he said, because he obtained the names of 18 from other sources.
