

Improvements Under Way on Two County Buildings

Two building improvement projects are under way in county-owned structures, the county court reported this morning.

The court announced advertisement of bids this morning on an automatic fire alarm system for the Jackson county farm home.

This is the second phase of a two-phase fire safety project at the farm home, County Commissioner Chester Wendt said.

The first phase was completed recently with provision of two more exits, establishing automatic closing fireproof doors, placing a metal covering on the dumb-waiter and fireproofing all drapes. The fire alarm system would automatically close the doors when it went off, Wendt explained.

The fire alarm system is in lieu of an automatic sprinkling system and the substitution is agreed to by the state fire marshal, Wendt said.

Meanwhile, plumbing at the Jackson county juvenile detention home is being placed overhead to avoid an electrolysis problem with underground water pipes, Wendt said. The electrolysis caused the pipes to rust through from the outside in. Cause has not been established. He noted repair crews had to go through the detention home floor eight times to fix holes in plumbing.

Congressmen Face Indictments on Conspiracy Charges

Washington - UPI - Reps. Thomas F. Johnson (D-Md.) and Frank W. Boykin (D-Ala.), were indicted Tuesday on charges of conspiracy in conflict of interest, the Justice Department announced. The indictments, returned by a grand jury in Baltimore, involved almost \$25,000 in alleged payments and at least \$3,250,000 in real estate transactions.

Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy said the two congressmen were charged with conspiring to accept the money and to participate in the real estate deal in exchange for attempting to influence the Department of Justice to dismiss an indictment against a Maryland savings and loan association figure, J. Kenneth Edlin.

Defeated in Primary Boykin, whose name had been linked with the Maryland savings and loan scandal previously, was defeated this summer in Alabama's Democratic primary.

The indictment against Edlin was not dismissed. Edlin, 64, Miami Beach, Fla., and Miami attorney William L. Robinson, 37, an associate of Edlin, also were named as defendants in the eight-count indictment which was returned after 10 months of investigation.

Kennedy said the conspiracy count listed 36 separate or joint telephone, mail or personal contacts made by the congressmen with the Department of Justice on behalf of Edlin between March and November, 1961.

Johnson is currently running for reelection against Rogers C. B. Morton.

Members of the county and Jackson county planning commission representatives plan to inspect a possible location at the corner of Big-ham, Brown and Antelope rds. Miller said two acres of land are needed where burning car bodies will not cause an air pollution problem. He emphasized that no definite location has been established yet.
