

## Driving Faster Than West Coast Plane Schedules

Portland — (UPI) — A witness from Burns told the Civil Aeronautics Board here Wednesday it is faster to drive to Portland in the summer because West Coast Airlines schedules are so bad.

Orville Corbett and other Eastern Oregon spokesmen pleaded for a continuation of West Coast service—with improved timing.

Corbett said better schedules would make it possible for Burns to provide the five passengers a day needed for retention of subsidized local air service under the CAB's "use it or lose it" policy.

The CAB is considering letting West Coast stop scheduled service to Bend, Redmond, Lakeview, Burns, Baker, Ontario, Newport, Toledo, Payette, Idaho; Logan and Ogden, Utah; and Bellingham and Omak, Wash. The hearing also involves proposed changes in United Air Lines routes to other cities.

### Better Schedules Asked

Witnesses from Burns, Lakeview, Klamath Falls and Ontario all asked for continued service with better schedules. All pointed out they are badly isolated.

Joseph A. Sawyer, manager of the Klamath Falls airport, urged retention of service to Bend, Burns, Lakeview and Salem, all tributary to Klamath Falls. He and other witnesses suggested that Lakeview be served on a new Reno, Nev., route and Burns be served on the Boise-Portland route.

John M. Leshner and H. F. Logue of Ontario said their city might provide five passengers a day if West Coast could offer a morning flight to Portland. He said about 15 Ontario residents a month now drive to Boise to catch a faster flight to Portland.

Howard Goodnough of Lakeview said it was unfair to expect the small community to muster five passengers a day.

Corbett said under present routing, West Coast now flies 494 miles of travel to Portland—a direct air distance of 273 miles.

## Little World's Fair Damaged by Storm

Damascus, Ore. — (UPI) — The Little World's Fair, which weathered a financial storm earlier this year, fared less well in Friday's winds.

Garland Wiley, president of the fair, said three buildings on the fairgrounds "exploded like match boxes" when the hurricane-force winds swept through the Damascus area.

Another building and part of the fair office lost parts of roofs; fences around the outdoor theater went down along with part of the theater building.

Wiley was unable to estimate damage loss, but said it would be a "big loss." He said the damaged property was not insured.

The Little World's Fair closed last summer and Wiley said at the time it would reopen in the summer of 1963. He said he would confer with members of the fair board to decide what to do.

## Country's Power Needs Emphasized

Vancouver, Wash. — (UPI) — America must build the equivalent of a Grand Coulee Dam every two months to meet this country's power and energy needs, Undersecretary of the Interior James K. Carr said Wednesday.

Carr spoke at the dedication of a new high voltage testing laboratory built here by Bonneville Power administration.

He said the United States faces staggering demands for energy.

"More than anything else I want to make it clear that we must abandon any provincial, 'neat little' approaches to the nation's energy supply problems," Carr emphasized.

He said private and public power agencies in the Northwest have made a "commendable" beginning.

### Discount Stores Now Extending Services

New York — (UPI) — Discount stores are branching out from their strictly cash-and-carry function, according to a survey by Audits and Surveys company, which reports 81 per cent of 1,278 stores covered in the study now extend credit to customers and delivery services are provided by 33 per cent.

Sales volume of discount stores continues to grow rapidly, the survey indicated. Total volume of the stores, studied was \$4.4 billion last year, compared with industry estimates of a \$2.9 billion volume in 1960.
