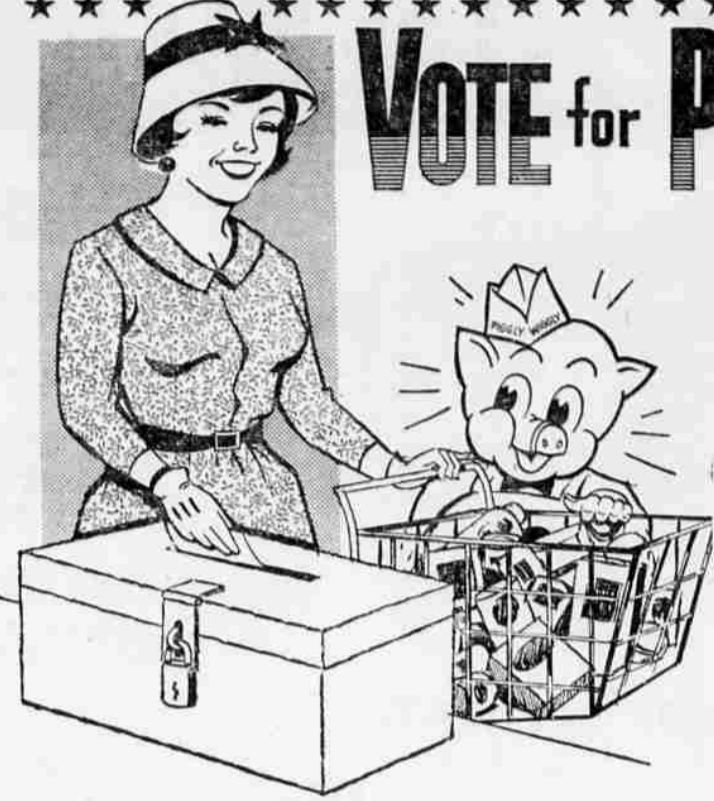
Foolish Mockery

I will instead ask that you, Eric Allen, reconsider your position on DST. Mind, I am not asking you to change your personal preference for DST, but that you throw your influence against Proposition 6 because of the flagrant immorality involved. A sly bit of political trickery is about to be put over on the people of this state.
Up to now you have shown a fine appreciation for the integrity of representative government and the values of democratic method. Yet Proposition 6 as it confronts the electorate is an outrage on both.
