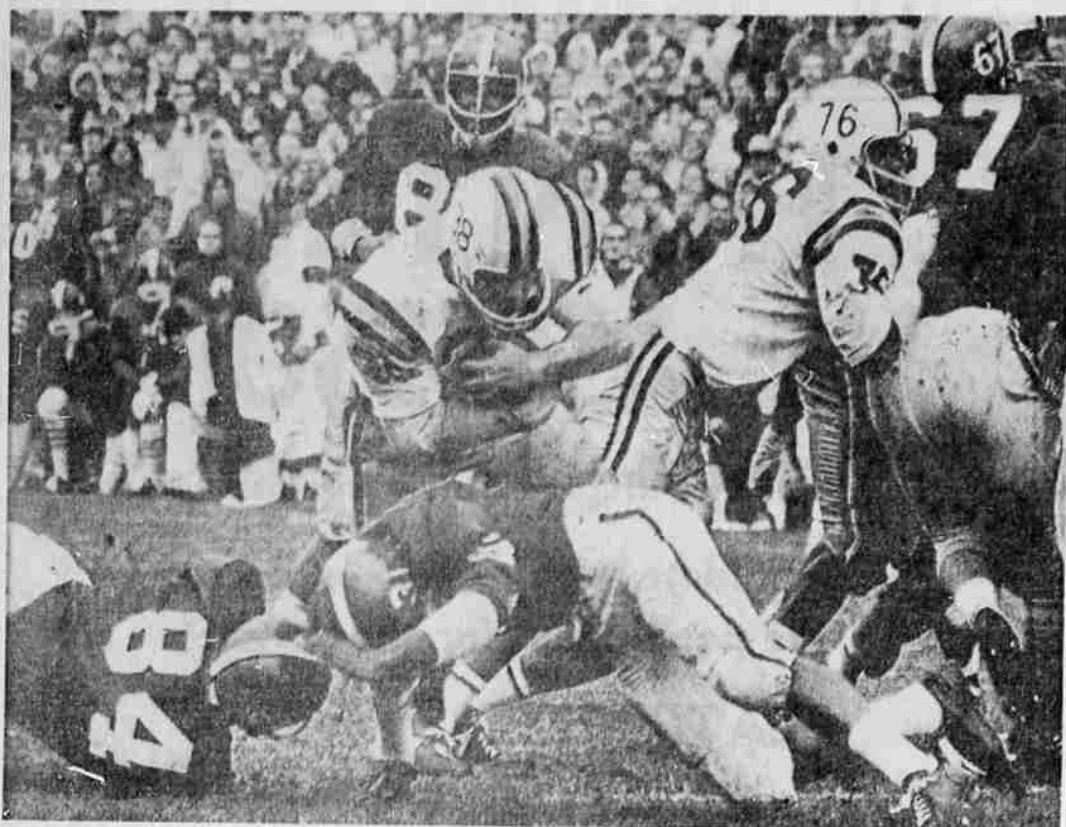

Lakers Win 4th in Row On LA Floor

The 15,000-seat Memorial Sports Arena is not exactly humble, but the Los Angeles Lakers still insist there's no place like home.

Given their usual two-pronged scoring punch from Elgin Baylor and Jerry West, the Lakers Sunday night breezed by the suddenly helpless New York Knickerbockers, 125-106, to complete a sweep of their opening four-game home series.

Coming home with 1-4 record after dropping four straight games on the road, the Lakers will leave with a 5-4 record and third place in the National Basketball Association's Western division standings.

New York, perennial last-place finisher in the Eastern Division, won its first two games this year including one over the Lakers. But the loss Sunday night was their eighth in succession.

Even though Laker Coach Fred Schaus kept them on the bench much of the game while playing his rookies and reserves, Baylor finished with 29 points and West with 27. Veteran Willie Naulls led the Knicks with 18 points.

Rookie Gene Wiley, whom the Lakers hope will turn out to be their answer to Bill Russell, hauled in 26 rebounds. The 6-foot-11 Wiley grabbed 14 in the second quarter to break Russell's arena mark.

LA's Rams Held To Studstill

Los Angeles — (UPI) — The frustrated Los Angeles Rams, attempting to go for a second straight win, were held to a stud-still Sunday, by the Detroit Lions.

Pat Studstill, a rocket-legged halfback who was signed after being given the opportunity for a Detroit tryout, scored the game's only touchdown and raced punt returns of 37, 35 and 33 yards in key situations as the Lions rallied to whip the Rams 12-3.

It also was an Earl Morrall victory for Detroit. Morrall, used in the Lions' previous National Football League games this season only to hold the ball on place kicks, took over the quarterbacking in the third period and hurried the touchdown pass to Studstill.

Newland Choice Of Federation

Portland — (UPI) — Bob Newland of Eugene was elected president as the Oregon Track and Field federation was formed here Sunday.

Bill Foelker of Milwaukie was chosen vice president and Al Buller of Portland was picked as secretary-treasurer. About 30 high school and college coaches were present at the organizational meeting.

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New York Giants Nose Out SL Cards for 8th Straight Triumph Over NFL Opponent

The New York Giants chorused a loud "nuts!" to the gag that no team wants to win the Eastern Division of the National Football League because they'd have to meet the Green Bay Packers in the championship playoff.

Even though the Giants took a 37-0 shellacking in last season's playoff game, they're busting their shoulder - pads for another crack at the Packer super-team that now has bowled over eight straight NFL rivals with no sign of letting up.

The Giants played what Coach Al Sherman described as a "flat" game Sunday, but they battled from behind three times in the final period to edge the St. Louis Cardinals, 31-28, and take over first place in the Eastern Division from the Washington Redskins.

Cowboys made the Giants' ascent possible when they upset the Redskins, 38-10, before the largest crowd ever to watch a sports event in the nation's capital.

Packers Drub Bears
Meanwhile, the Packers, once again playing without injured Paul Hornung, disposed of another Western Division challenger by drubbing the Chicago Bears, 38-7.

In other games, the Detroit Lions remained two games behind the Packers by beating the Los Angeles Rams, 12-7; the Baltimore Colts upset the San Francisco Forty Niners, 23-7; the Pittsburgh Steelers defeated the Minnesota Vikings, 39-31, and the Cleveland Browns played a 14-14 tie.

Pels Trip Crater in JV Tussle

Central Point — Klamath Union high trimmed Crater 20 to 14 here Saturday afternoon in a junior varsity football fray.

A touchdown by Crater, which could have meant a tie or even victory, was called back in the second quarter. Chuck Taylor intercepted a pass in the Comet end zone and ran 102 yards to the Klamath goal. However, clipping was called on Crater and the Comets were given the ball on their 30-yard line.

Klamath tallied first in the second period and twice again in the third. Both Crater TDs which counted were in the final quarter.

A Randy Smith to Bud Lummus pass for nine yards got one touchdown for the Pelicans. Tom Diver scored twice, from eight and two yards out. Don Graham kicked two extra points.

A Roger Neufeld to Chuck Taylor pass was good for about 50 yards and the first Crater marker. Detlef Kirken-dall ran 35 yards for the other. Taylor carried for both extra points.

Duck Slate Not Getting Any Easier

Eugene — (UPI) — "Washington State figures to be an explosive team with good passing and running. Our schedule is not getting any easier."

That's the way Oregon football Coach Len Casanova today viewed the Duck's Homecoming game against the Washington State Cougars here next Saturday.

The Ducks, with halfback Mel Renfro scoring three touchdowns, defeated Stanford 28-14 at Portland Saturday before 29,895 for their fifth win of the season.

"Washington State has good speed and some real fine players," Casanova said. He pointed out that he particularly was worried about stopping the Cougars' end Hugh Campbell and fullback George Reed.

"I think we looked pretty good although things got sloppy toward the end of the game," Casanova said of Saturday's tangle. "I think Renfro and Berry were outstanding."

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Trojans, Wildcats On Collision Course

Live images are beginning to appear through the haze surrounding college football's bowl picture.

You don't need 20-20 vision to realize that Northwestern and Southern California are on a collision course leading to the Rose Bowl. And three Southeastern conference powers are steaming toward possible return engagements in the other major post-season classics.

Mighty Alabama appears ready and able to defend its Sugar Bowl crown, Mississippi could draw a rematch with Texas in the Cotton Bowl, and Georgia Tech or Louisiana State may wind up in the Orange Bowl.

Third-ranked Southern Cal, which hasn't played in the Pasadena classic since 1955, moved into sole possession of first place in the Big Six conference via a 14-10 victory over eighth-ranked Washington.

Second-ranked Alabama blanketed Mississippi State, 20-0, for its 18th consecutive victory, fourth-ranked Mississippi beat LSU for the first time in five years, 15-7, and Georgia Tech rolled past Duke 20-9.

Fifth-ranked Texas and ninth-ranked Arkansas continued their scrap for the host berth in the Cotton Bowl. The Longhorns survived their fourth straight squeaker, turning back Southern Methodist, 6-0, on a second quarter touchdown by Tommy Ford while Arkansas spanked Texas A & M, 17-7.

Two other members of the UPI top 10 suffered convincing setbacks. Minnesota remained in the Big 10 conference race by overpowering seventh-ranked Michigan State, 28-7, and Missouri strengthened its bid for an Orange Bowl berth by handing 10th ranked Nebraska its first loss, 16-7.

Finally Believed
"We knew Washington State would be tough but our boys didn't doubtly believe it until today," Coach Tommy Prothro of the Beavers said after the closely fought contest.

Baker, abandoning his usual formula for getting touchdowns on passes, collected scores on runs of 1, 12 and 32 yards. He completed 7 of 13 passes for 124 yards and ran for 59 more yards for 182 total yards.

"Baker is the best quarterback I've seen in a long time," Washington State Coach Jim Sutherland said. "We figured we'd have to stop him and I think we did a better job than most of the teams Oregon State has faced this year. But it wasn't good enough."

Forty Niner Blocking Falls Down

San Francisco — (UPI) — "When your blocking breaks down," observed coach Red Hickey of the San Francisco Forty Niners, "you can't move the ball."

"And I never saw our blocking worse than it was Sunday."

Hickey was talking about his club's worst-ever lack-of-power display in taking a 22-3 beating from a Baltimore Colts unit that also showed very little on offense—although displaying a solid defense.

Hickey took it upon himself to call all the plays in this game and brought back the "trifecta" quarterback combination, with Bill Kilmir, John Brodie and Bobby Waters working at quarterback. But all it appeared to do was to confuse the offensive line.

The quarterbacks seldom were able to throw a pass before they were snowed under. The whole Forty Niner team gathered only 81 yards from rushing and 70 from passing.

Throughout three quarters it was a pretty close ball game, with the Colts leading by the cozy baseball score of 5-3.

They had scored on a safety that picked up two points when San Francisco was called for holding behind its own goal line, and on a 37-yard field goal by Dick Bielski.

San Francisco scored on a 24-yard field goal by Tommy Davis. That was about it as the 44,823 fans alternately yawned and booed through the first half.

Then in the closing minutes of the third quarter, Brodie fumbled on his own 33, the Colts recovered and moved on to a touchdown with Johnny Unitas passing six yards into the end zone to Lenny Moore for the score.

That sewed up the game for the Colts.

WSU Coubabes Humble Rooks

Pullman, Wash. — (UPI) — The Washington State Coubabes scored four touchdowns in the second half to defeat the Oregon State Rooks 41-13 in a college football game here Saturday.

Quarterback Ray Joao passed for two scores and ran for another to spark the Coubabes, who held a 14-7 lead at halftime.

The Rooks scored on one-yard runs by Craig Cording and Marv Crowston.
