River Yields Last Of Chlorine Tanks

Vidalia, La.—(AP)—The last of four large tanks of potentially deadly chlorine gas was raised from the bottom of the Mississippi river Monday and reloaded into a barge.

Elaborate civil defense preparations had been made for the emergency evacuation of about 80,000 residents within a 30-mile area in the event the chlorine leaked from the tanks and became gas on contact with air.

The tanks were aboard a barge which sank 19 months ago. Salvage operations were ordered by the federal government for fear the 75-foot tanks might rust and leak. The first tank was lifted from the sunken barge on Oct. 24.

The tanks were taken downriver to the Wyandott Chemical Co., at Geismar, La., and the chlorine was transferred to storage tanks. The barge was not touched because authorities did not consider it a hazard.

Bond Interest Not Exempt From Taxes

Salem—(AP)—The interest on bonds issued by irrigation districts and other political subdivisions is not exempt from taxation under Oregon law, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton said Monday.

Such bonds are not direct obligations of the state as are other bonds defined in the Oregon constitution, Thornton said.

Charles H. Mack, chairman of the State Tax Commission, requested the opinion.
