

Skinner Will Pilot Boat in Salton Sea 500-Mile Marathon

Lon Skinner, Medford, was signed last week to co-drive the new 19-foot hydro-boat racing inboard, "Dandruff Too," in the Salton Sea 500-mile on Nov. 10 and 11.

This boat is owned by millionaire hair oil manufacturer Dick Stephens of Miami, Fla., and is capable of speeds well over 100 miles-per-hour. For the 500-mile race, the boat will be piloted by Skinner and Stephens' son, Dick Jr. Two drivers are needed because of the severe punishment to both drivers and boat by the rough waters of the Salton Sea.

Word has just been received from the American Powerboat association that Skinner's new record of 78.89 mph, average for five miles of competitive racing was set July 29 of this year on Green Lake in Seattle, Wash. Skinner held the record for a year, during 1961 and '62, at 74.9 mph. Then, on July 15 at San Diego, Don Towel of Los Angeles raised the mark to 77.3 mph. Two weeks later Skinner recaptured the record.

Tornado Junior Varsity Defeats Ashlanders 12-0

Two of Medford's four completed passes went for the only touchdowns here last night as the Tornados turned back Ashland 12 to 0 in a junior varsity football game.

Jack Mullen heaves to Greg Dippel clicker for the scores in the first and third periods. The first, a screen pass, was good for 31 yards and the second, a throw down the middle, went for 18 yards.

The first touchdown came three plays after Medford took over the ball on the Ashland 37-yard line following a short punt by the Grizzly's Dave Barger.

For the second counter the Junior Tornado moved 71 yards in 14 plays aided by an offside penalty against Ashland. The scoring play was on fourth down. The push actually got underway following an interference with fair catch call against Ashland which moved the ball from the Medford 14 to the 29. A Mullen Dippel pass for 13 yards bolstered the march.

Interception Stops

Closest to the goal Medford gained, otherwise, was the 10 yard line in the fourth quarter. The opportunity came when Medford's Rick Newland knocked the ball out of Barger's hand as he was trying to pass and John Yoakley recovered. That gave Medford possession on the Ashland 14-yard line. After a gain to the 10, a Mullen pass was intercepted in the end zone by Roger Atherton and run out to the one-yard line.

Aided by a Barger to Atherton pass to 41 yards, Ashland reached Medford 18 in the first quarter. Don Scholer fumbled and Curt Wyatt nabbed the ball for Medford on the Tornado 12 yard line.

Medford ran up 207 net yards at scrimmage and Ashland 130. First downs numbered nine for Medford and seven for the Grizzlies.
