Jewish Settlers  
Who Left Israel  
Now Returning

Haifa, Israel (UPI)—Many Jews are immigrating to Israel for the second time.

Persons who came to Israel once, then emigrated elsewhere, are coming back in ever-increasing numbers. Thousands of these had settled here, then moved on because of difficulties in adjusting to a new life, economic hardship, the threat of war with the Arabs, a desire to be with relatives in other lands or, perhaps, because distant pastures looked greener.

Since 1948, when this Jewish nation was established, there have been 130,000 immigrants who subsequently settled elsewhere. The highest number of departures in a single year was 13,000 in 1952, a period of austerity, controls and border violence. About 40,000 Israelis emigrated to the United States and another 25,000 went to Canada.

## Many Return

Now, many of them are coming back. Why?

For one thing, economic conditions have improved. There is a labor shortage, the economic system has been greatly liberalized and nearly all controls have been lifted. Job security, the encouragement of free enterprise and Social Security-type programs of the government have lured back many.

Other emigrants found distant pastures weren't so green.

An Israeli family located a member of their war-separated family in Rio de Janeiro and emigrated to Brazil. After the excitement of reunion wore off, the former Israelis discovered the facts of economic life were bitter. Peddling drygoods was not an easy or especially rewarding pursuit and there were problems over lack of familiarity with the local population and the language. The family returned to Israel.

Some Israelis in other lands found they must keep relatively silent about their dissatisfaction with the government or its officials, even minor ones. Israeli people helped themselves quickly to a good measure of freedom and, in Israel, felt free to express their displeasures about housing, taxes, and other matters. Anti-Semitism

There also was, in some cases, a sudden awareness of the existence of anti-Semitism, however mild. Jews native to many nations other than Israel accepted a certain amount of anti-Jewish sentiment but it came as a shock to some transplanted former Israelis.

"How could I do this to my children?" exclaimed one returning Israeli.

It is official government policy to welcome back any former citizens who wish to return. However, should the government lend financial aid to the "re-returns" as it does to first time immigrants? The question is being debated in official circles and among officials of the Jewish Agency, official voice of world Jewry.

No firm policy has been established. However, the government sent help to 400 former Israelis in Brazil who said they wanted to return. Some help has been doled out to persons in other countries, too.

Israeli leaders believe a returning Israeli is a good influence. He serves as a brake on others planning to emigrate, they say. He may also have influenced prospective immigrants from the country in which he lived temporarily.

This is a nation which has attracted more than a million citizens from other countries and it hopes to attract many more.

## COLLEGE MEANS CASH

New York (UPI)—The median annual income for men who have completed four years of college is \$7,261 or \$2,209 more than that earned by those with only a high school education, the National Industrial Conference board reports. For men with five or more years of college, the median is \$7,691, or \$430 above the income of those with four years of higher education.
