Space Craft Power Device Developed

Litchfield Park, Ariz. (UPI)—A device that can provide future space craft with power equivalent to that used by three modern homes is under development at the Goodyear Aircraft corporation facility here.

Ground tests of the big dish-shaped device, called a solar concentrator because it collects energy from the sun, will begin early next year. In actual use, it would be packed into a two-part cylinder, slotted into space and unfolded. Plastic foam would give it the required rigidity.

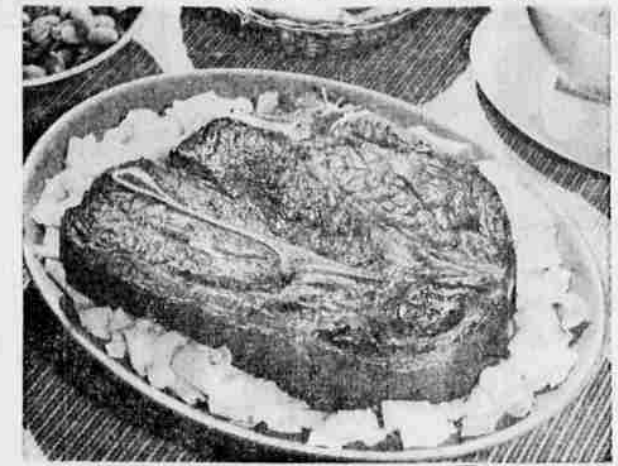
