

Sheriff's Deputies Investigate Burglary
 Jackson county sheriff's deputies are still investigating the burglary of Pearson's market, 915 West McAndrews rd., over the week end. Thieves entered the market by prying loose a bar across the back door. The owner gave the sheriff's office a long list of items missing which included lighters, pens, candy, beer, wine and cigarettes. The burglars also sprayed shaving cream over the inside

of the store, pulled items from shelves, scattering them, and spilled milk, sheriff's officers reported.

Building Industry Sees Loopholes in Prospect for 1963
 Washington—Home builders expect to do about as well in 1963 as they have this year—and it's been a pretty good year—but they are worrying about some big "ifs."
 Home buying could suffer, they fear.
 A tense international situation gives the public war jitters.
 The economy weakens.
 An executive order by President Kennedy prohibiting racial and religious discrimination in federally-assisted housing upsets prospective buyers. The President is authoritatively reported to be planning to issue the order before the end of the year.
 These apprehensions were voiced by 15 builders at the seventh annual builders' intentions conference of the National Association of Home Builders. The 15 were among 70 surveyed by the association. Opinions expressed at the conference jibed with those reported by the broader survey.

The builders expect their industry to put up 4 per cent more apartment units next year but 1 per cent fewer single-family houses. A majority expects housing starts in 1963 will equal this year's estimated total of 1,390,000 private, non-farm dwelling units. The 1962 performance is the best since 1959.
 Several of the builders suggested that most Negroes would not, because of the order, try to buy houses in neighborhoods in which they were unwelcome. Arch Hermanns of Chicago said a Negro police officer told him that he wanted a house and neighborhood equivalent to those of his white buddy on the police force but did not desire to move in next door.
 Negroes Seem Anxious
 J. W. Brosius of Frederick, Md. said Negroes "seem to be anxious to live among their own kind." He said that issuance of the order would lead whites to "wait-and-see before buying." Open occupancy "is an issue charged with emotion," he said, "one case of a Negro who feels he must live in a white neighborhood could cause trouble."
 Experts on discrimination in housing say that in many cases the presence of only a few Negro families has not caused a mass exodus from a previously all-white neighborhood or the retreat of all prospective white buyers from a new subdivision. But, say the experts, there is a "tipping point."
