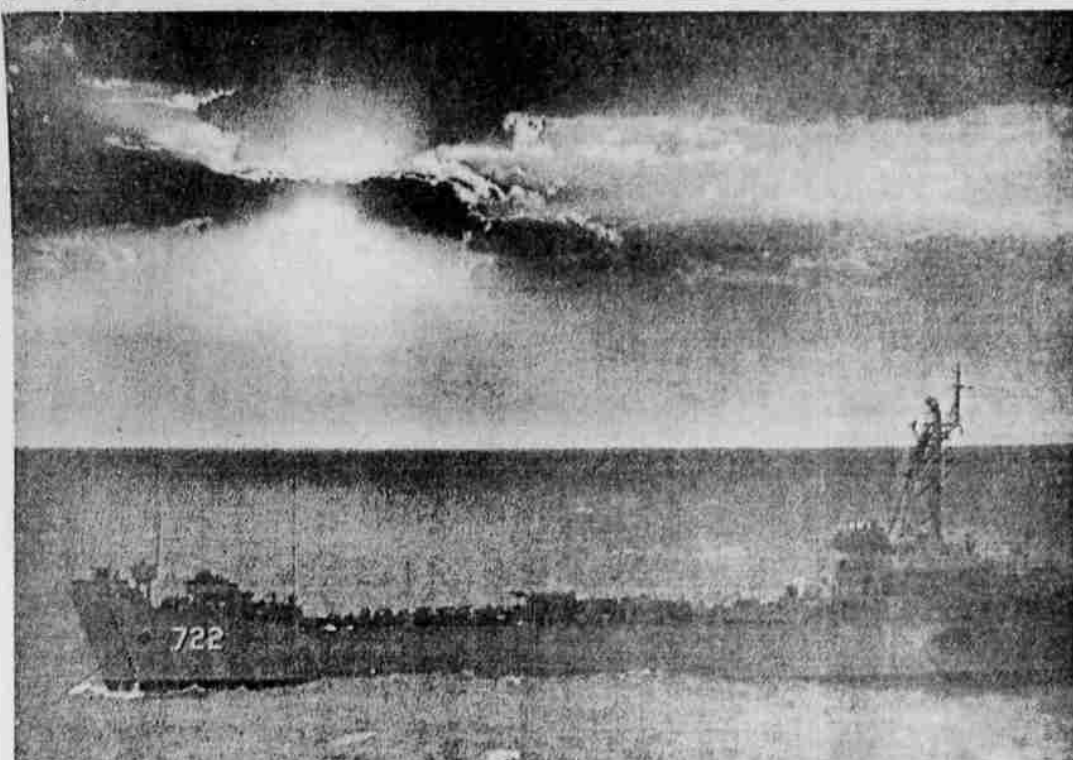

425 Foreign Students Are Enrolled at UO

Eugene — The University of Oregon has 425 foreign students from 61 nations attending classes this fall — the largest number in the university's history.

Sixty more foreign students are registered than were last year. The 1961 figure was 365.

Advice Is Given On Food Quacks

University Park, Pa. — (UPI) — Food quacks prey on people to the tune of \$500 million a year says Louise W. Hamilton, extension nutrition specialist of the Pennsylvania State university.

Miss Hamilton contends the way to combat dishonest food peddlers is to consult a family doctor, a dietitian, or a home economics advisor for nutritional advice.

She pointed out that many food quacks try to scare people into buying their products, and warns of salesmen who claim that disease is due to improper diet or depleted soil, that chemical fertilizers are harmful to plants and that some foods are wonder foods.

All Areas of Study

The graduate class has the most members — 200. Forty-two are freshmen; 53 sophomores; 40 juniors and 45 seniors. Forty-five are classified as special students.

Expert Gives Advice On Interior Design

New York — (UPI) — Furnishing a house or apartment? A word of advice comes from Robert Feldman, interior designer.

"If you get your window and floor coverings done first," said Feldman, "the room looks warm and furnished even if it contains nothing but a piano."

Feldman is an official of Feldman Brothers, Inc., which for 35 years has served as consultant on interior design to home owners, decorators and stores.

"Don't hurry the furnishings job," said Feldman. "Good decorating may take years to accomplish."

Practically all areas of study have at least one foreign student represented. But the most heavily concentrated is in business administration. Eighty-six are registered in the several fields within the school of business administration.

Architecture and allied arts have attracted the next highest number with 41 enrolled. Twenty-seven are majoring in health and/or physical education, 27 in economics, 26 in chemistry, 24 education, 23 political science, and 20 math.

The majority of foreign students are men. Only 80 of the total enrollment are women. Of those majoring in business administration, three are women. Two are from the Philippines and one from Syria.

Seven countries each have a woman studying architecture at the university. They are Thailand, Korea, Japan, Iran, Finland, China, and Canada.

Among those interested in business administration, 21 are from Canada; 14 from India; and 9 from Japan. Architectural students come from 23 countries. China and Iran have five each; Korea four, and Canada, three.

Special events for foreign

students are sponsored by the Foreign Student Friendship Foundation, an organization of Eugene residents and faculty. These include a reception in the fall, a farewell dinner in the spring, trips to different parts of the state and arrangements of "friendship families" in the Eugene area for visitors.



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
