Feeding the Family

Glazed Ham With Fruit Is Festive

If it's ham you're choosing for holiday feasting, consider the convenience and unvarying goodness of canned ham which is fully cooked, needs only "finishing up" in gala fashion. You'll find that canned ham is really kind to your budget because it is boneless, waste-free, has just enough fat for flavor.

Many meat men will slice your canned ham in slices one-quarter inch thick and tie it back into shape. Or you can do it yourself. In either case, it does make the ultimate serving much easier, more attractive, particularly when serving a crowd. Why glaze it with fruit like this for showing off.

- 6 to 12-pound canned ham**
Whole cloves
1 No. 2½ can cling peach halves, apricot halves or pear halves
1 tablespoon cornstarch
2 tablespoons vinegar
3 tablespoons prepared mustard
1 ½ cup unsulphured molasses

Slice ham in one-quarter slices and tie back into shape. Insert cloves in top edge of every other slice. Place in shallow baking pan. Drain peaches or other fruit; measure liquid and, if necessary, add enough water to make 1½ cups. Mix cornstarch and vinegar in a saucepan until smooth. Blend in mustard, peach syrup and molasses; bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Baste ham with small amount of this sauce.

Bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees, planning 10 minutes per pound. Baste twice during baking period. Stud fruit halves with cloves. Fifteen minutes before end of baking time, place fruit halves around ham and pour remaining syrup over them. Serve fruit as garnish with perhaps a bit of mint for added color.

Relish Assortment!
Relish assortments take on party airs during the holidays. A colorful array of crisp celery hearts, glistening ripe olives, balls of nippy cheese rolled in finely chopped parsley or chives and apple slices sprinkled with cinnamon sugar will certainly be eye-stoppers and appetite accelerators.

To give ripe olives a lively sheen, dry them on paper towels and roll in a few drops of olive or salad oil.

Date Confection
This date confection is so easy to do that the very young children of the family can have fun fixing them. Grind together one cup pitted fresh California dates and one-half cup each seedless raisins and currants. Mix in one cup peanut butter and four tablespoons sweetened condensed milk. Shape into small balls and roll in powdered sugar; place on wax-paper-covered plate. Chill until firm.

Avocado Dip
Mashed avocado seasoned with salt, onion, lemon juice and a dash of Tabasco is one of the most popular of all cocktail dips. To give it party twist, add chopped shrimp or chopped salmon to the mixture.

Pickled Prunes
Pickled prunes are fine accompaniment for pork, beef, lamb or poultry. Turn one pound tenderized prunes into one quart or two pints of pickled prunes.

Wash one pound tenderized prunes. Stick two whole cloves in each prune. Soak in three cups water for two hours. Add one cup dark brown sugar, one cup vinegar and four three-inch sticks cinnamon. Bring to a boil. Simmer 30 minutes. Chill overnight in syrup.

Creamed Onions
Traditional Thanksgiving vegetable in many families is the creamed onion. We make it a dish of rare delight by adding a three-ounce package of Philadelphia cream cheese and some diced canned pineapple (optional) into the white sauce.

Figure on two pounds small onions (or two cans) for each six servings. Cook peeled onions in boiling salted water to cover about 30 minutes. Drain. Add to well-seasoned

white sauce as suggested. Onions may be boiled the day before; added to sauce at serving time if you like.

Poultry Stuffing Uses
Many find it convenient and flavor-satisfying to use the ready-prepared, pre-seasoned, toasted or corn bread poultry stuffing mixes on the market today.

Interesting thing is that they may be kept handy not only for poultry and pork stuffing, for using in meat loafs, for casseroles and to add flavor and texture interest to tossed green salads.

Stuffing Variations: For poultry stuffing variation, add walnuts, chopped ripe olives, chopped chicken livers, mushrooms, oysters or other preferred ingredient.

Turkey Sandwich Memo
One sure way to encourage family and friends to say "this is the best turkey sandwich I ever ate" is to salt and pepper each individual sandwich after you've buttered or mayonnaised the bread, arranged thin slices of both light and dark meat generously. Whole cranberry sauce and plenty of crunchy celery alongside.

Curried Pecans
Combine two tablespoons salad oil, one-quarter teaspoon garlic powder and one-half teaspoon salt in a heavy fry pan. Add two cups pecan halves and toast over medium heat seven to eight minutes, stirring constantly. When thoroughly heated, sprinkle with one-quarter teaspoon curry powder; mix.

Series of Cases Heard in County Juvenile Court

A series of cases were heard in Jackson county juvenile court Friday, Larry Tweedy, juvenile department director, reported.

Many of the cases involved truancy and joy riding in stolen cars.

A 17-year-old girl was sent home on probation after being consistently truant from high school. A 16-year-old boy was out of school, living in an apartment, had no job and was reported beyond parental control. He was placed on probation.

A 14-year-old boy was returned to his parents on probation after being found consistently truant and "joy riding" in stolen cars. A 15-year-old boy consistently truant while on probation received a suspended commitment to McLaren School for Boys and was returned to his parents under strict rules of probation.

Referred to Commission
A 10-year-old Medford boy who had been in detention for 58 days was referred to the Jackson county public welfare commission for foster home placement. He had been mixed up with another boy in a series of thefts, Tweedy said.

A 15-year-old Ashland boy was charged with joy riding in stolen cars and went home to his father on probation.

A case presented by the public welfare commission resulted in the children being released to relatives. A 16-year-old child was transferred to Douglas county and the case dismissed. One case was held over until next Friday to obtain further medical information. Four cases were dismissed after satisfactory completion of probation. A runaway 17-year-old boy was released to his mother after being held in the county jail.
