Frosted Grapes An Artistic Garnish

Grapes have been a favorite decorative theme since the earliest days of the graphic arts. You will see luscious clusters of grapes, a few leaves and the airy tips of tendrils worked in silver, bronze and glass or shown brilliantly in oils or some other medium.

Frosted grapes cut into small clusters make artistic garnishes for fruits, meat or fish salad, or for a variety of desserts. Wash and dry grapes. Cut into small clusters and brush each with slightly beaten egg white. Hold over waxed paper and sprinkle with fine granulated sugar.

Spiced Cranberry

Here is a spiced cranberry catsup for enlivening pork, turkey, duck, chicken, veal or ham. Recipe makes 1 1/4 cups.

Wash cranberries and cook with vinegar and water in a covered saucepan five minutes or until soft and tender. Strain through a sieve. Add brown sugar, spices and salt. Simmer until mixture begins to thicken, about three minutes. Stir in butter or margarine. Pour into a jar and store at room temperature.

Branded Sweet Potatoes For Vegetable Deluxe

Sweet potatoes, rather than the sweeter yams, are perfection for this deluxe accompaniment for turkey, chicken, duck, pork or other festive roast. Here are six to eight servings depending on how many other vegetables you're having.

4 cups mashed sweet potatoes
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
1/16 teaspoon ground black pepper
3 tablespoons sugar
1 tablespoon heavy cream
1/4 cup brandy
1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted
2 teaspoons grated orange rind

Combine first eight ingredients. Mix well and add three tablespoons of the melted butter or margarine. Turn into a buttered one-quart casserole. Brush top with remaining melted butter or margarine. Sprinkle with grated orange rind. Bake in a preheated moderate oven, 375 degrees, 30 to 40 minutes or until browned.

Cranberry Glazed Ham Worthy of Special Occasion

Whether you chose to bake your ham starting with one of the smoked bone-in hams, a semi-boneless ham, a smoked fully-cooked boneless ham, a smoked and fully cooked boneless ham roll or a canned ham, here's a super way for glazing it, displaying it handsomely and adding to flavor and fragrance.

One half hour before end of baking time indicated for the ham of your choice, proceed like this: Score fat with knife, stud with two dozen long-stemmed cloves. Return ham to baking pan. Any fat that has collected in pan

Refused Order

Students of the slain teacher said the gang burst into the classroom and ordered Ramirez to suspend classes in commemoration of the first anniversary of the death of a terrorist shot while attempting to burn a bus.

Authorities obtained a warrant to enter the autonomous Central University of Venezuela and arrested Jorge Ramon Villalobos Anez, 22, who was charged with murder.

The university, like many in Latin America, is traditionally off-limits to law enforcement bodies.

Villalobos, who graduated last year from the school where Ramirez taught, was identified as a member of the Communist-line movement of the revolutionary left.

Police searched Villalobos' room in a dormitory known as "Stalingrad" and said they found radio equipment, hand grenades, a pistol which ballistics experts said was used in the slaying, and a supply of bullets.

Teacher Jose Damian Ramirez, father of seven children, was fatally beaten and shot Thursday night, reportedly by a Communist gang terrorizing a downtown Caracas night school.

Eight Points Listed for Persons Having Accidents

No one likes to think about having an accident, but accidents do happen every day to hundreds of people in Oregon alone.

When an accident does happen, failure of drivers to take certain steps can complicate the settlements and involve drivers in many difficulties.

For that reason, Medford Chief of Police Charles Chumplin outlined eight points drivers should know if they are ever involved in an accident.

The chief's suggestions were:

- 1. Stop. Failure to stop at the scene of an accident is a serious violation of the law.
2. Help the injured, but do not try to move an injured person unless he is in a place of danger.

Police were seeking a university professor who reportedly tried to help the murder suspect escape.

Call for an ambulance or others who are qualified for this.

Police should be called in the event of a fatality, injury or extensive property damage. When calling, be sure you know the exact location of the accident; street address in urban areas; highway number, distance from nearest town or route junction in rural areas.

Show Driver's License

Show your driver's license and registration and give your name to other parties involved. Be sure you get this same information from them.

Record the names of drivers, passengers and owners of other vehicles involved, or the owners of other property damaged in the accident.

Get names and addresses of witnesses. Record addresses of nearby buildings from which persons may have seen the accident.

Don't get into arguments over who was at fault. Don't discuss the accident with others involved or with bystanders.

Submit your written report of the accident to authorities within 24 hours. This report can be filed with city or state police, a sheriff's office or directly to the Department of Motor Vehicles. In addition to reports required by the state, be sure to report the accident to your insurance company no matter how minor it may seem. Never try to make a roadside settlement.

Six Area Teachers Evaluating Guide

Four Medford and two Ashland teachers have been selected by the Oregon Heart association to participate in the evaluation of a new curriculum guide for teaching about the heart and circulatory system in Oregon schools.

Teachers selected are Marly Ramp and Miss Audrey Silvers, both Hedrick Junior High school; Charles Madary and Miss Jean Shepherd, both McLoughlin Junior High school, and Millard Johnson, Ashland High school, and Lance Lock, Ashland Junior High school.

The local teachers will be among the 105 especially chosen teachers in the state whose classes this year will use the new curriculum guide developed during an intensive two-week workshop sponsored last summer by the Oregon Heart association's school health committee, the state department of education, Oregon State university and Portland extension center.

The teachers will pioneer in teaching the course this year, then report their evaluations to a committee who will revise the guide before its final printing. The guide is the first such material to be prepared for use by Oregon schools, and is designed for junior and senior high school students.
