Washington (Special)—The Kennedy Administration plans to retreat from its attempt to impose an annual tax on America's fast-growing number of boat owners. By strongly protesting to Congress, the boaters have licked the administration's plan to levy an annual \$5 tax on all motor and sail boats between 14 and 16 feet in length, with an extra \$2 for every foot of length over 16 feet.

not in government recreation areas. Presumably boaters who used waters in federal recreation areas, whether man-made or natural waterways, would have to buy an auto sticker to reach the area with their cars and boat trailers.

One index of the mounting popularity of even the man-made lakes since the onset of the postwar boating boom are figures compiled by the Army's Corps of Engineers for recreation visits to the reservoirs created by the dams the Corps has built. Visitation went up from 5 million in 1946 to 166 million in 1960.

Another major change in the conservation fund bill designed to improve its popularity is addition of a provision for turning 60 per cent of the money over to the states for their own park programs. The old bill provided only for modest planning grants to the states.

While the national parks are more widely heralded for their beauty and drew some 72 million visitors last year, state parks last year had 273 million visits, including 21 million overnight stays, according to reports compiled by the government's new Bureau of Outdoor Recreation in the Interior Department. Oregon parks had 12.2 million visitors. Only five states had more.
