Portland—(UPI)—Fishermen who have claimed that oil exploration blasting is hurting ocean fish catches have been asked to chart areas where seismic testing can be carried out without hurting fish runs.

The request was made by H. E. McCracken of Shell Oil Co. James F. Parker, president of the Oregon Fishermen's Marketing Association said he met with McCracken and Rep. William Holmstrom this week and discussed the matter.

Parker said a committee of fishermen will prepare a chart showing areas which are relatively free of fish. The area would involve the Pacific Ocean between Newport and Destruction Island, Wash.
