This event is always one of the major social events of the winter season here, and gives many persons a chance to shop.

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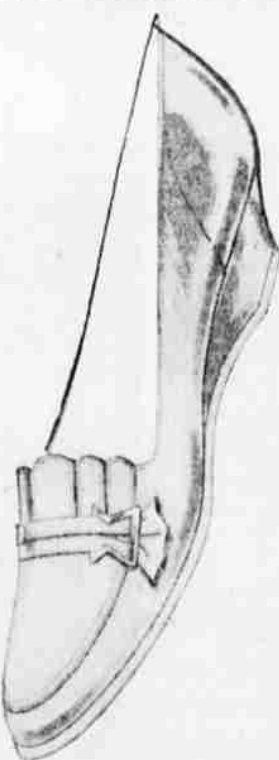
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
