

Salem—(UPI)—Expansion of the Oregon Correctional Institution (OCI) so it can handle 509 inmates will be asked of the 1963 Legislature by the Board of Control.

Present population at the institution is 286.

Superintendent Paul J. Squier explained the OCI was opened in 1959 to provide re-

habilitation for first offenders of all ages.

A vocational building is now being erected by inmates, and is expected to be completed by Jan. 15, he said.

Eastland Charges 'Blackmail' Over Integration Crisis

Jackson, Miss.—(UPI)—Sen. James O. Eastland (D-Miss.) has charged the action of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools following the racial crisis at the University of Mississippi was an attempt to "blackmail this state and its people."

The accrediting agency put the university and six other state schools under close and continued observation because of political interference with Negro James Meredith's attempt to register as a student.

Eastland also charged the association was "covering up Marxism in the colleges" and the activities of "certain professors at the university."

"I don't think the states can permit Marxism on the campuses," he said. "I don't think the states can protect those groups that are lined up with reds."

The senior senator spoke at the annual meeting of the Mississippi Soil Conservation society.

"I'm not going to talk about soil conservation," he said. "If we don't have a free government and if we can't control our own affairs we aren't

going to have soil conservation or anything else."

He termed the association's action a "cover-up of an attempt by certain University of Mississippi professors to intimidate students."

He related nine incidents of alleged intimidations by Ole Miss professors which he said were supported by affidavits from investigators of his Senate internal security subcommittee which investigated rioting on the campus.

He quoted one professor as saying "Gov. Ross Barnett should be impeached."

When the riot broke out Sept. 30, "University officials should have hustled the demonstrating students into dormitories, and if they (the students) refused, they should have been machinegunned," Eastland quoted the professor as saying.

"Any student who torments me I will shoot down," Eastland quoted the professor.

IN BATTLE TESTS
