Funeral services for Mrs. Orrie Bernice Stoddard, 85, who died at a local convalescent home Friday, will be held at 1:30 p.m. Monday. The Rev. George S. Roseberry, pastor of the First Methodist church, will officiate. Entombment will be in the Acacia Memorial mausoleum, Seattle, Wash.

Mrs. Stoddard was born at Tipton, Iowa, Aug. 20, 1877. She was the daughter of John Howell McCroskey and Ada Louisa McCroskey, and spent her early life in Iowa.
