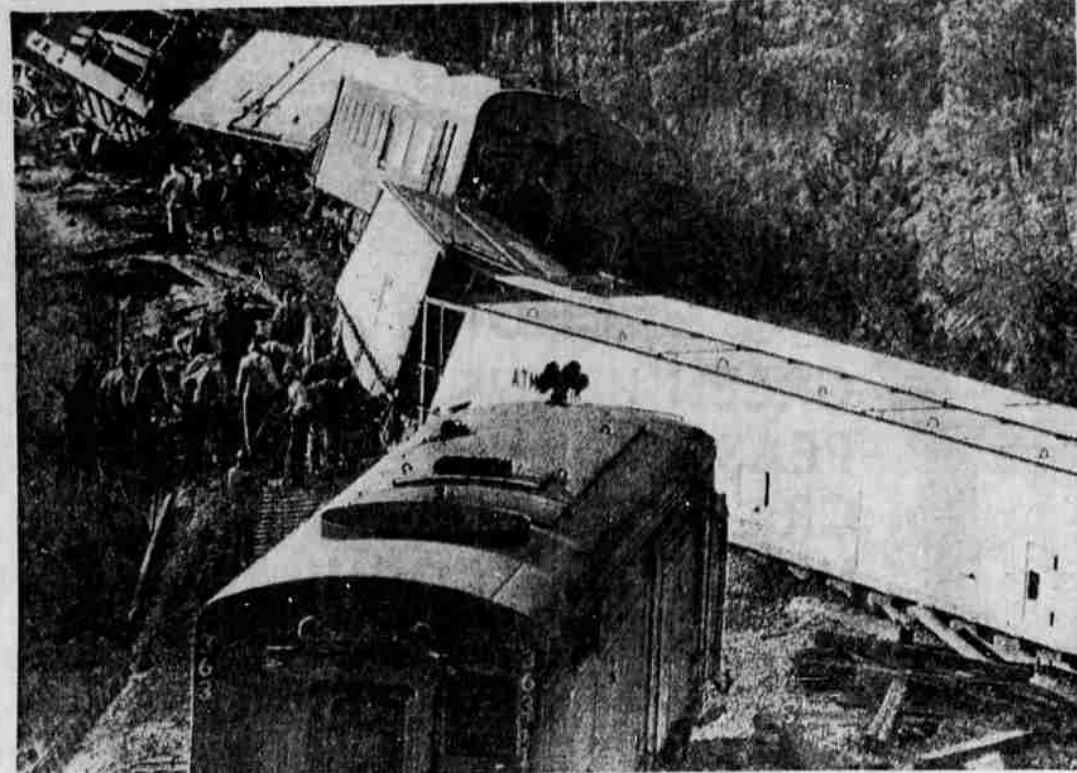

Unemployment of Teen-Agers Cause Of Rate Increase

Washington — (UPI) — A sharp and unexpected rise in the number of jobless teen-agers caused the nation’s unemployment rate to rise three-tenths of 1 per cent during November to 5.8 per cent of the total labor force, the Labor Department has announced.

Unemployment usually rises during November but the increase from 5.5 per cent in October to 5.8 per cent caught Labor Department experts by surprise.

They were unable to explain why there was suddenly an increase of 150,000 in the number of unemployed teen-agers between 14 and 19 at a time when there is usually no increase in this category. Most of the jobless teen-agers are boys between 18 and 19.

Seymour Wolfbein, the Labor Department’s unemployment expert, said the 5.8 per cent rate was as high as it has been any time this year and reflected economy which is “holding its own but making no forward thrust.”

The rate a year ago was 6.1 per cent.

Wolfbein said there was no significant change in the employment rate for men and women between October and November.

Practically all of the change was due to the teen-agers. The unemployment rate for them was 13.3 per cent in October and rose to 15.2 per cent in November.

The number of jobless boys rose from 650,000 to 750,000 during the month.

Wolfbein said it had not yet been determined whether the new unemployed teen-agers were dropouts from school entering the labor market or whether they were teen-agers who lost their jobs.

‘Circuit Rider’ Repair Scheduled

Salem — (UPI) — The “Circuit Rider,” a cast bronze statue toppled by a falling tree during the Columbus Day storm, is in a Vancouver, Wash., sculptor’s shop for repairs.

The statue of a circuit rider astride his horse was donated to the state in 1924 and stood in the park east of the Capital Building here.

After Oct. 12 it rested nearly upside down where it was toppled from its pedestal.

The head was partially crushed, and most of the seams were split.

Sculptor James Hansen of Vancouver is the only man on the West Coast qualified to do the repair work, according to Dale Mallicoat, administrative assistant to Secretary of State Howell Appling Jr.

Repairs were estimated to cost from \$3,800 to \$5,400, Mallicoat said. Emergency funds were to be used to pay for the repairs, which may take up to eight months to complete.

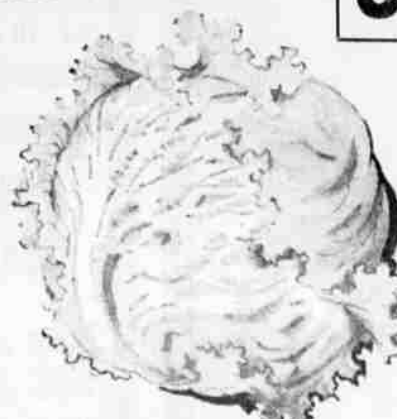
