

# Final Hour Rally Sends Market Up

New York — (AP) — A final hour rally sent the stock market ahead modestly today following some softness in the earlier hours.

The market sold off initially, partially recovered later in the morning, sank again over the noon hour and then loitered until rallying tendencies developed on a sporadically late tape in the final hour.

## Truck on Runway Studied as Cause Of Plane Crash

Washington — (AP) — Investigators today looked into the possibility that a maintenance truck, lost in the fog, blundered across the runway just before an airliner crashed and killed 23 persons last Friday night at Idlewild Airport.

They said it might be the reason why Capt. Edward Bechtold, who died in the wreck, tried to abort his landing. They theorized that he mistook the truck for an airplane in the fog.

**Fog Patch Evident**

Sources close to the investigation said evidence still seems to show that a large and extremely thick patch of fog moved over the runway as Bechtold brought his Eastern Air Line DC7B in, robbing him of all forward vision.

They theorized that if a maintenance truck wandered over the runway accidentally, Bechtold might have seen only the glow from the flashing red light atop the vehicle. He might have thought it was the plane that landed just ahead of him.

### CUBAN REFUGEES SAID ATTACKED BY GUNBOATS

Mexico City — (AP) — Cuban refugees charged today that two Castro gunboats machine-gunned and sank a small boat in which 20 persons were trying to flee from Cuba Sunday, killing most of them.

The Student Revolutionary Directorate said the attack occurred near Boca de Galafre in the western province of Pinar Del Rio.

A DRE spokesman quoting underground sources said the gunboats Rapido and El Coloma sighted the fleeing Cubans soon after their boat put to sea from Boca Del Galafre.

They opened fire immediately, the spokesman said, and after the boat had been sunk they machine-gunned would-be refugees who were clinging to the wreckage.

### Morse Protests Use Of Canadian Lumber

Washington — (AP) — Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) today protested the use of Canadian lumber in minor construction jobs at the capitol.

Morse, in a letter to Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) complained of finding scantlings used in temporary walkways and barriers at an excavation beside the Senate office building.

This, the Oregonian complained, was not in line with President Kennedy's July 26 directive to federal agencies to use U.S. lumber for federal construction. He asked Mansfield, chairman of the Senate Rules Committee, to call the capitol architect's attention to the directive intended to aid the domestic lumber industry.

Pacific Northwest lumber interests have complained of increasing Canadian competition.

# Tape-Recorded Transcript Confirms Ellender's Statement About Africans

Salisbury, Southern Rhodesia — (AP) — A tape-recorded transcript issued today of Sen. Allen J. Ellender's news conference here confirmed he was quoted correctly on statements which led Uganda and Tanganyika to declare him a "prohibited immigrant."

Ellender, currently touring Africa, held the news conference last Saturday before leaving Salisbury, Uganda and Tanganyika banned him from entry and several newspapers denounced him for saying he had not seen any Africans ready for self-government and they were incapable of leadership without white assistance.

The official transcript, issued by the U.S. Information Service, showed the Louisiana Democrat said during the conference:

"My own government of course, supports the United Nations effort to make as many of the countries of Africa independent as desire to be or happen to operate their own governments. Now, personally, I wouldn't have any quarrel with that if those who are to operate the government were competent to do so and had the capability. But I have yet to come to any of them wherein that capability exists and for that reason I stated that the time for this change to independence is a little too early."

"If there is any part of Africa wherein the natives have built up a community on their own, have used bricks and mortar and have manufactured things on their own and made progress on their own, I have yet to see that area."

"What I mean simply is that the average African is incapable of leadership except through the assistance of Europeans."
