

Russian Nuclear Announcement Seen

Geneva — (UPI) — The United States predicted Wednesday that the Soviet Union will announce shortly that it is halting all its nuclear tests starting Jan. 1 in an effort to pressure the West into accepting a moratorium on underground blasts.

The prediction was made by Ambassador Arthur H. Dean, chief American negotiator at the 17-nation Disarmament Conference.

He said the Soviet announcement probably would come from "the high level," by which he may have meant Premier Nikita Khrushchev although he did not specifically say so.

Daniel Boone Shrine Group Receives Gift

St. Louis — (UPI) — A tomahawk that once belonged to Jimmie Boone Callaway, daughter of Daniel Boone, has been sent to the Daniel Boone Shrine association for display in the old Boone home in St. Charles county.

Mrs. Vestal O. Hays of Ocala, Fla., donated the tomahawk. She is the granddaughter of Mrs. Callaway. The tomahawk is believed to be a memento of the capture of Jimmie Boone and Elizabeth and Frances Callaway by Indians July 14, 1776 at Fort Boonesborough, Ky. The women later were rescued.

YOUR CAR and the LAW

OREGON DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES

Editor's note: Following is the 10th in a series of 12 articles dealing with Oregon motor vehicle laws. Questions regarding state motor vehicle laws may be submitted to the Department of Motor Vehicles, Traffic Safety Division, Salem.

Oregon was one of the first states in the nation to pass a law providing for the admissibility of chemical test evidence in cases involving driving while intoxicated. The law was enacted in the early 1940's.

The law now in effect in Oregon provides that a person arrested and charged with being under the influence of intoxicating liquor may, upon his consent, be given a chemical test to determine the amount of alcohol in the person's blood.

The test may be of the blood, breath, urine or other bodily substance, but if a blood test is to be given only a duly licensed physician, or a person acting for the physician, may withdraw the blood. Several key words affect administration of the law. In the first place, the person must be arrested and charged with the specific offense of driving under the influence; he cannot be asked to take a chemical test in connection with any other violation. Secondly, he must give his consent to the test. The consent may be verbal or written. Until 1961, consent had to be in writing.

Refusal Not Admissible
Should the person refuse to take a chemical test, none can be taken. Further, the refusal to permit a test is not admissible in evidence against him at his trial.

The law in Oregon, and most other states, provides that .05 per cent or less alcohol in the blood is prima

facie evidence that the defendant was not under the influence; over .05 per cent, but less than .15 per cent, is considered relevant evidence, but cannot be given prima facie effect in indicating whether or not the defendant was under the influence.

If, however, analysis shows that there was .15 per cent or more alcohol in the blood, this is considered prima facie evidence that the defendant was under the influence.

To understand these figures, it is necessary to explain briefly what happens when alcohol enters the stomach in the form of a beverage. Scientists say it is absorbed through the walls of the stomach and the small intestine into the blood stream. The blood carries it to all parts of the body which contain water, including the brain. Thus, the degree of intoxication and its effect on driving ability can be determined by the per cent of alcohol in the blood, breath, urine or saliva, though the latter test is seldom used.

Believed Too Liberal

Many scientists believe the .15 per cent figure is too liberal. Further experimentation, they say, indicates that practically all human beings are unfit to drive with as much as .10 per cent blood alcohol concentration, and that many are unfit at much lower levels.

Chemical test evidence is not as widely used as safety proponents believe it should be because many people refuse to permit a chemical test. Chemical test proponents maintain that greater use of the tests would protect the innocent, as well as aid prosecution of the guilty.

For Civil War buffs is a Union warship, "USS Kearsages," and the full-scaled Confederate blockade-runner, "C. S. Alabama."

Electronics Age
The electronics age ushers in exciting electronic toys. The importance of this can be judged by General Electric's entry into the toy business with a line of electronic experimental kits. Westinghouse has introduced a life-like doll whose voice, transistor radio hidden in her body, "speaks" by remote control.

On the other hand, Revell, Inc., a leading company in the now complex toy industry, has entered the electronic field with a line of kits to build a complete transistorized hi-fi stereo set up. Engineered and designed for professional appearance and performance, the three components of the easy-to-assemble kit include a hi-fi amplifier, a four speed stereo turntable and stereo headphones.

Created for the teen-ager interested in stereo and electronics, the kits will be available in electronic shops as

well as in toy and hobby stores. A transistorized four band short wave receiver that also brings in regular broadcasts is an additional unit in the line.

Santa Claus may well be the "largest volume auto dealer" in the world, with automobiles of every size, to please everybody, in his pack. In past years, toy automobiles were made primarily for pre-schoolers, now automobile racing sets of every description are designed for teen-agers and adults; and for small fry, too.

Imagination and creativity

are being emphasized in model cars and car kits of all types. Authentic scale model kits of the world's fastest car, Mickey Thompson's four-engine "Challenger I" — the award-winning "Outlaw" car designed by Ed "Big Daddy" Roth — or a Ford '56 Pickup Truck with doors and tailgate that actually operate, are but a few examples.

Stocking-Fillers

For inexpensive stocking-fillers, retailing at 50 cents and 70 cents each, there is a line of 1/25th scale custom car parts of jewel-detailed automobile engines, motor-

cycles, tires, bumpers, grilles, etc., to delight any car model builder — young or old.

Do-it-yourself is entrancing the girls, too. There is a doll house that can be expanded for a growing family; and for the girl horse-lover there is a kit of "Blaze King," the TV show's equine star, with a real hair mane and tail that can be combed and groomed, plus complete equipment for saddling up and a miniature greenhouse for raising miniature plants. Of course there are always dolls... dolls of every "age" and description. One of the newest is "Cathy

Baby" with its own recorded winsome voice.

A transparent, charted universe — chemistry and physics sets — miniature computers — models of Atlas and Mercury — an astronaut's chair to simulate space flight — will delight the serious minded. For the nature lover there is Instant Fish, minute dried fish eggs which when dropped in water, hatch immediately.

All in all, Christmas toy shopping this year might well prove the adage that there is as much enjoyment in giving as in getting.
