



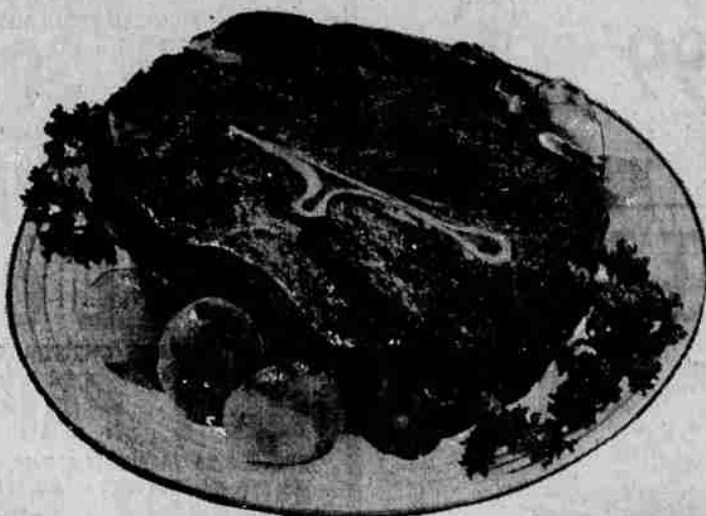

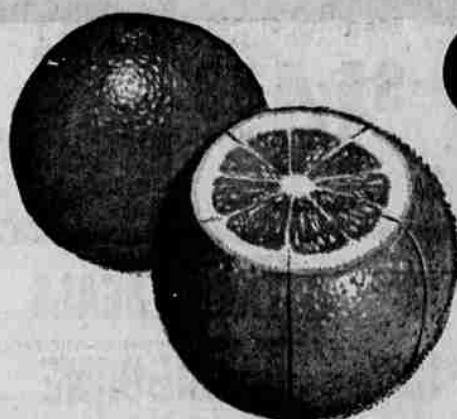

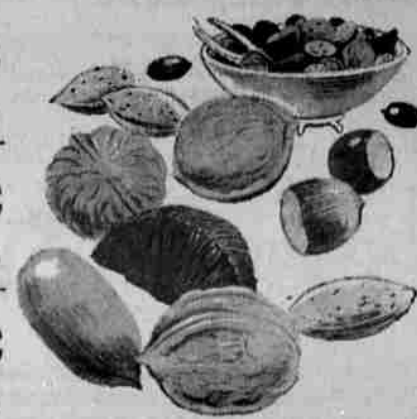

Association Hears Roseburg Doctor

Dr. Charles Wilson from the Veterans Administration hospital in Roseburg, spoke to the board members of the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association during a recent meeting at the Rogue Valley Country club.

In speaking on "Who's For Health," Dr. Wilson said that the nation is creating problems by more health and that the people have to get to work and solve these problems. He pointed out that with the increase in population persons also have a longer life expectancy, and because of this aging persons in convalescent and rest homes need reorientation.

He said many persons in the hospitals with tuberculosis and other lung diseases are there to stay until the end of life and need to be useful and loved.

Dr. Wilson said in some cases it is possible to move chronic patients nearer home and it is possible other plans could be worked out. He asked the question "What do you want for your tuberculosis patients?"

Charles Althaus, Portland, director of education for the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health association, was present during the luncheon. He was in Medford to attend the state convention of the Oregon Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.
