NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER

FOR SALE

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Medford, Oregon, beginning at 10:30 a.m. January 7, 1963, for all available timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing Sections 9, 16, 21, 22, 27 and 28, T. 30 S., R. 3 E., W.M. surveyed, in the Rogue River National Forest, Douglas and Jackson Counties, Oregon. The estimated volumes are: 7,440 M board feet of Douglas-fir; 1,880 M board feet of white fir and other species. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas-fir \$9.50; white fir and other species \$5.25. This includes the following rates: per M board feet for stumpage, including deposit for sale area between \$3.00 base rate plus an additional \$6.10 for Douglas-fir; \$2.00 base rate plus an additional \$2.45 for white fir and other species; and \$0.80 for slash disposal for all species. The stumpage rates payable for each species will be increased by the amortization rate in effect for that species when the unamortized estimated cost of the main haul roads has been amortized by timber sales. The unamortized estimated cost is \$125,254.00. Amortization rates are: Douglas-fir \$18.88 per M board feet; white fir and other species \$7.46 per M board feet. Amortization of estimated main haul road costs is computed on 80 percent of the estimated timber volume. The prices bid for stumpage shall be considered as tentative rates subject to quarterly calendar adjustment upward or downward by 0.5 percent of the difference between the average of the monthly Douglas-fir Region Index, as calculated by the Forest Service for the three previous months, and the Douglas-fir 100 Index, white fir and other species 100 Index. Such adjustment in the price for stumpage shall be applicable to timber scaled during the three-month period following the quarter for which the adjustment is computed. In no event, however, shall the payment rates for each quarter be less than the base rates as stated above. When the adjusted rates by species are lower than the base rates, the difference between the total dollar value of the timber cut at adjusted rates and at base rates will be recorded for each species. The stumpage rate for any species will not be increased above the base rate until the subsequent adjusted rates above the base rate for all species develop an accumulated total dollar value in excess of the total recorded accumulated difference for all species. Sealed bids will be publicly opened and voted, at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Medford, Oregon, at 10:30 a.m. on January 7, 1963. All those who submitted a satisfactory sealed bid will be permitted immediately to continue auction bidding. A money order, bank draft, cashier's or certified check in the sum of \$2,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied to the purchase price, refunded, or retained for application to any claim for damages, according to the conditions of sale. If requested by the purchaser, contract terms will permit felling of timber in advance of payment up to the value of the performance bond. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the District Ranger, Prospect, Oregon, or the Forest Supervisor, Medford, Oregon, before bids are submitted.

Bank Customer Gets Deposit Slip After Hectic Few Minutes

Elizabeth, N.J. — (UPI) — The bank robbery might have been a pushover except for Robert Dischler, a young man with stars in his eyes who saw red when the heist threatened his wedding.

He became furious when he saw the \$1,600 he had saved for a nest egg dumped into the bandits' bag Wednesday along with \$59,000 of the bank's money . . . before he had his deposit slip.

"I was just thinking about my \$1,600," Dischler, 24, a service station attendant, said. "You can't get married without money, can you? I wanted to get my money back."

Besides, he wanted some of the money to buy an engagement ring Christmas present for his fiancée, Loretta Herman, 21.

Dischler became so angry

he grabbed the 38 caliber pistol one of the bandits carried, shot him in the stomach, fought a gun battle with the other bandit, and when all the bullets were used up, hurled the empty revolver with all his might at the fleeing robbers.

Chases Bandits

Then he charged them with his bare hands and chased them from the bank, one of them clutching his stomach where he had been shot.

Dischler was not nicked in the flurry of bullets that followed his bold move. But bank guard William Petuskey, 65, a former policeman, was wounded trying to help. A bullet grazed his head. He did not carry a gun because it is against bank regulations. The guard was reported in fair condition in a hospital.

When the two bandits entered the bank, Dischler was the only man present. There was one woman customer, and three women tellers.

"This is a stickup! Give us your money," one of the bandits demanded. One stayed by the door, his gun covering the tellers and two customers. The other walked up to the teller cages with a brown leather satchel.

Tellers Surrender Money

Sandy Miller, who has been employed at the bank only four months, quickly shoved her money into the bag. So did Mrs. Hannah Buz-

zone at the next window. When the bandit came up to Mrs. Martha Johnson, the teller where Dischler was waiting, he made his move.

"I swung at him . . . we both made it to the floor, grappling," he said. "He dropped the bag and that money went all over the floor."

"I disarmed him and I fired one shot at him . . . in the stomach. With that, the other guy at the entrance opened fire on me and between the two of us, we emptied the guns."

"When the guy on the floor heard the click of my gun . . . that it was empty . . . he got up and started to run away. I threw the gun at him. I ran after him as the other fellow ran out the door."

Dischler said he would have chased them further, but one of them turned and pulled out a knife.

"I backed away," he said. Minutes after the bandits had jumped into a car where a third man was waiting, police and FBI agents arrived. They started to take Dischler to headquarters to look at "mug shots" of possible suspects.

"Wait a minute," Dischler shouted. He dashed back into the bank.

"I want my deposit slip." With a shaking hand, one of the tellers made it out.
