Christmas Festival Is Scheduled Sunday

The Congregational church will meet for worship and church school at 11 a.m. on Sunday at Hoover Grade school on Siskiyou blvd. at South Modoc rd.

The Rev. Robert W. Tull, minister of the church, will preach the second in a series of Advent sermons dealing with the meaning and the message of the persons involved in the birth of Jesus. This week's topic is "The Wise Men—They Offered Him Gifts."

As a part of the morning service of worship, the members and friends of the church will make their pledges of financial support to the church's budget for 1963. At the congregational meeting Nov. 25, the budget for the coming year was set at \$13,936 for operating expenses and benevolences. Those who are not able to make their pledges during the church service this Sunday will be visited during the following week.

The fourth annual all-church Christmas festival, which had to be postponed last Sunday because of the flood conditions, will be held Sunday from 2:30 to 6 p.m. The festival will be held at the YMCA building.

Tuesday evening the regular monthly meetings of the board and committees of the church will be held.

Victory Dinner Planned by Medford Friends Church

The master of ceremony for the dinner will be Dr. Claude Lewis, Central Point, chairman of the Friends church finance board. Speakers include former pastors, Dr. Milo C. Name of Joseph To Be Said in Mass First Time Dec. 8

The usual Saturday catechism classes for grade school children attending public schools will not be held tomorrow, Dec. 8, according to a Confraternity of Christian Doctrine announcement.

Classes will resume according to schedule on Dec. 15 in St. Mary's Grade school.

Dec. 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on the universal calendar of the Roman Catholic church, is a holy day of obligation for all members of that faith residing in the United States.

Masses in Sacred Heart church will be said at 6, 7, 8, and 9 a.m. and at 12:10 and 6 p.m. so that all parishioners may meet that requirement. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception commemorates the Catholic belief that the Virgin Mary, because she was to become the mother of Christ, was from the time of her conception preserved from the effects of the sin of Adam and Eve.

Joseph's Name Added

This year the feastday has been selected by Pope John as the date for the solemn closing of the first session of the Second Vatican Ecumenical council. Also on this date Catholics attending mass throughout the world will hear the name of Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, read in the Communicantes of the mass for the first time.

The addition of Joseph's name is the first major change in the part of the mass known as the Canon since the sixth century and was accomplished largely through the efforts of priests and laymen alike, who, since 1815, have been petitioning for this honor for St. Joseph. In 1870, at the time of the First Vatican council, Pope Pius IX honored a petition by naming the saint the patron of the Universal church. Last year Pope John proclaimed St. Joseph the protector of the coming ecumenical council.

Tomorrow will also be the Saturday of the monthly adoration program in Sacred Heart church. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 1 p.m. with general parish adoration continuing until 9 p.m. and the men's nocturnal adoration beginning at that time and continuing until 6 a.m. Sunday.
