Improvements in Wages Suggested
Portland--(UPI)--Improvements in minimum wage levels for women and minors employed by hospitals, nursing homes and child care facilities have been recommended by a wage and hour conference board of the Oregon Wage and Hour Commission.
New minimums of 90 cents an hour would be established in nursing homes and hospitals next July 1, increasing to \$1 an hour a year later. Minimums in child care facilities and homes for the aged would go to 85 cents.
Present minimum in both categories is 65 cents. This has been in effect since 1960.
A hearing will be held Jan. 8 here.
