

Western Nations Competing Vigorously To Train Algerian Students

Algiers — (UPI) — The United States and other western nations are competing fiercely with the Communist bloc to train students from newly independent Algeria.

The first group of 15 Algerian students left here recently for the United States to take an intensive six-months English course at Georgetown University. All are preparing for a bachelor of science degree.

Another group of 19 flew to the United States last week to continue studies interrupted by more than seven years of war with France.

By January there will be 125 Algerian students in the United States. France is expected to take between 700 and 1,000, and West Germany 70.

More than 200 Algerians are studying in Communist bloc universities, including 50 in Russia, 40 to 50 in Yugoslavia, 40 in Bulgaria and 75 in East Germany.

Since Algeria became independent last July the Institute of International Education, which is supported by the U.S. government, has made 50 scholarships at American universities available to Algerian students. The grants cover travel expenses, tuition and an allowance of \$200 to \$300 monthly for board, room and incidentals.

Another 25 scholarships have been given by the United States National Student association. Before independence, the Ford Foundation and the American Friends of the Maghreb made scholarships available to about 50 young Algerians.

Algerians sent to the United States to study have been handpicked by the Algerian Education Ministry on the basis of their record in the war with France. The ministry's policy is to send only science students, since this young country is desperately short of both teachers and facilities in this field.

One student, who declined to give his name, is a young Algerian-born European from Oran who served with the rebel forces against the French. Another, a Moslem, said he spent four-and-a-half years in French jails after being arrested by French paratroopers during the bloody "Battle of Algiers" in 1956.

Another student formerly was a "political commissar" with the rebel guerrilla forces.

Behind in Courses

Other were active in the National Liberation Front, the former Moslem rebel organization, now the sole political party in the country.

Some students are three and four years behind in their courses.

Among the universities to which they are expected to be admitted in 1963 are Pennsylvania, UCLA, Wisconsin, Ohio State, Oklahoma, North Carolina, Indiana, Texas and Columbia.

One or two also hope to attend Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Algerians studying in Iron Curtain universities also are mostly taking courses in science and engineering. Students here said requirements for entry into Communist bloc low compared with those for universities are extremely American universities.

Article Defends Stevenson Role

Washington — (UPI) — The Adlai Stevenson controversy flared anew Monday when a national magazine said the White House "opened doors" for reporters whose article attacked the UN ambassador.

Life magazine said that President Kennedy had requested Charles Bartlett, an old friend and one of the authors of the critical article, to help prepare a semi-official chronology of events in the Cuban crisis.

It said that Bartlett "joined talents" with Stewart Alsop and "thereafter, on White House orders, the doors of the State Department and of the Central Intelligence Agency were thrown open to the two reporters."

The Life article, written by Time-Life Washington bureau chief John L. Steele, sharply contradicted the recent Alsop-Bartlett article in the Saturday Evening Post saying that Stevenson favored a soft policy on Cuba.

Hatfield Proposes 'Summit' Meeting

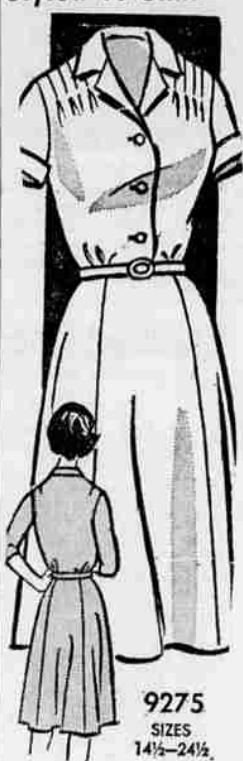
Palm Springs, Calif. — (UPI) — Oregon Gov. Mark Hatfield has proposed that New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller and Arizona Sen. Barry Goldwater hold a Republican "summit" meeting that could help develop a basic Republican ideology.

Hatfield said Republican party thinking appeared to have polarized around Goldwater and Rockefeller. He said a meeting of the two could help to remove what he called a "personalized factionalism" within the party.

Goldwater and Rockefeller probably are not as far apart in their thinking as some adherents might believe, Hatfield said.

The Oregon governor added that he believed Rockefeller could not be stopped in his bid for the 1964 presidential nomination "if he conducts an aggressive campaign, including competition in the various preferential primaries."

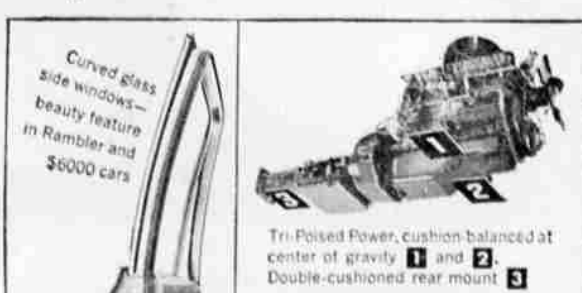
