The paper company purchased control earlier this year of an Arkansas timber and forest products firm which had owned and operated the railway. Georgia-Pacific has headquarters at Portland, Ore.

Airline Stewardess Statistics Noted

Fort Worth, Texas — (UPI) — Each time American Airlines graduates a stewardess it figures she will average two and a half years flying before she resigns to get married or take another job. In that period, she will:

- Be on duty in the air for 1,900 hours.
- Be on duty on the ground for another 1,100 hours.
- Walk 300 miles up and down the airliners.
- Fly about 180,000 miles.
- Serve 7,700 meals aloft.
- Make 3,500 landings and takeoffs.
- Transfer bases three times.
- Achieve a measure of pride in her profession that invariably will make her say years later: "I was a stewardess once myself."

Sellish Interests Seen in Pollution

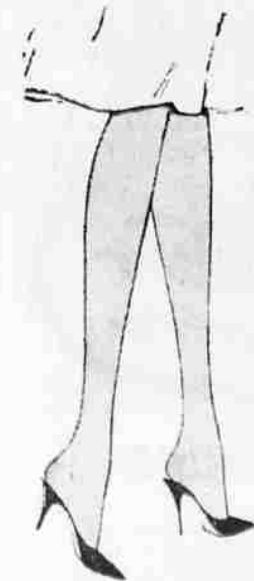

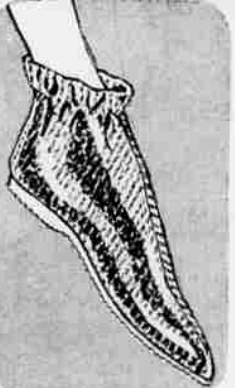

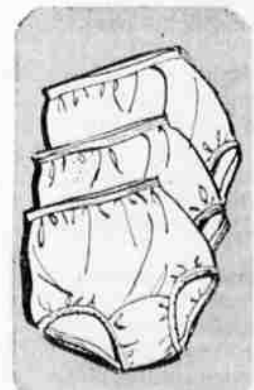
