



State Emergency Board Meeting Set for Dec. 18

Salem — (UPI) — A meeting of the State Emergency Board has been called for 8 p.m., Dec. 18 — during the legislative fiscal orientation conference here — it was announced Wednesday.

State Finance Director Freeman Holmer said \$29,443 in unallotted funds will be in the emergency fund Dec. 17. A request for \$17,500 of that money will be submitted by the executive department to cover arrest and return of fugitives, leaving only \$11,943 in the fund if the request is granted.

Holmer said more than \$717,000 from the fund had already been set aside for other requests coming before the Dec. 18 meeting.

Status To Be Discussed

Among items on the agenda for the meeting is a discussion of the status of the emergency fund, Holmer said.

He said the Tax Commission, University of Oregon Medical School, and State Treasurer have already indicated they will not need all of the money now set aside for their departments.

These requests for use of additional already allocated funds are slated to be presented at the meeting: — \$347,640 for construction of the radiation center building at Oregon State University.

— \$42,228 for survey of the pine shoot moth infestation and to control the Hemlock Looper infestation in Clatsop county.

Expenses Included — \$1,155 for payment of administrative expenses, legislative Interim Committee on Social Problems.

— \$3,100 additional money required for personnel services for the remainder of the current biennium for the State Soil Conservation Committee.

— \$5,000 to provide sufficient funds for administrative expenses for the remainder of the current biennium for the State Board of Dental Examiners.

— \$39,134 to Department of Finance to finance the expense of workload increases due to new family welfare direct distribution program.

— \$109,147 to Department of Education to increase expenditure limitation to reflect revised federal allotment of funds for vocational education.

Hearings Urged on Quarantine Rules

Salem — (UPI) — The Oregon Department of Agriculture has urged the U. S. Agriculture Department to hold full public hearings before changes are made in quarantine rules on plant pests and disease.

At present, protection of domestic plantings is accomplished through port of entry inspection and quarantine. The proposed federal rule change would have inspections made in the country where grown, rather than in the port of entry.

The federal government has not planned any public hearings on the change.

Oregon Supreme Court Decisions

Salem — (UPI) — The Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday upheld validity of a school district's authority to issue bonds to finance construction of swimming pools at high schools.

The decision was made in connection with a Gresham School District case.

Roscoe L. Fanning, a taxpayer, argued that although the Gresham district is empowered to construct buildings of various types with money raised through taxation, the authority to contract bonded indebtedness is limited to school buildings.

It was argued that a swimming pool is not a school building within the meaning of the statute.

Within Definition Justice Kenneth J. O'Connell noted that a pool in this case was to be built as part of a covered structure and therefore would fall within the definition of a building.

The decision also said that a building is a school building if it is designed to carry out a part of the instructional program authorized by the

district, and in this case the district had adopted instruction in swimming as part of its educational program.

"The construction of facilities upon the land necessary to carry out this instructional function is authorized whether it is surrounded by walls, or covered by a roof or unenclosed," the high court ruled.

In other decisions the Supreme Court affirmed: — A judgement of \$17,050 recovered by the state land board against the Port of Portland as royalty for river bottom material removed by the port. The port had dredged material from the Columbia river which it used to fill, widen and extend a runway and industrial area at the Portland International Airport. A substantial portion of the dredged material was used at locations more than half a mile from the bank of the Columbia river, and the State Land Board sought royalty on that material.

Contempt Upheld — The conviction of Andrew Taylor for contempt of court. The contempt consisted of remarks made by Taylor to Marion County Judge George A. Jones during the course of a post-conviction proceeding being heard by Judge Jones.

— The conviction of Charles Lee Sanders of Hood River on a charge of attempted rape against a 9-year-old girl. Sanders alleged insufficiency of proof.

— A divorce decree granted by the Benton County Circuit Court which awarded the divorce to Cecil Cathcart and also gave him custody of a 9-year-old son.

In the same executive order the President also added to the official list of communicable diseases hemoletic streptococcal infections as a substitute for scarlet fever and streptococcal sore throat.

The list also includes a number of other diseases from anthrax to yellow fever.

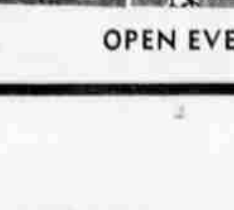
