A regular meeting will convene at 8 p.m., with Mr. and Mrs. Donald Shores presiding as worthy matron and worthy patron.

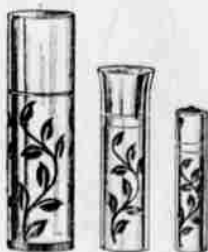

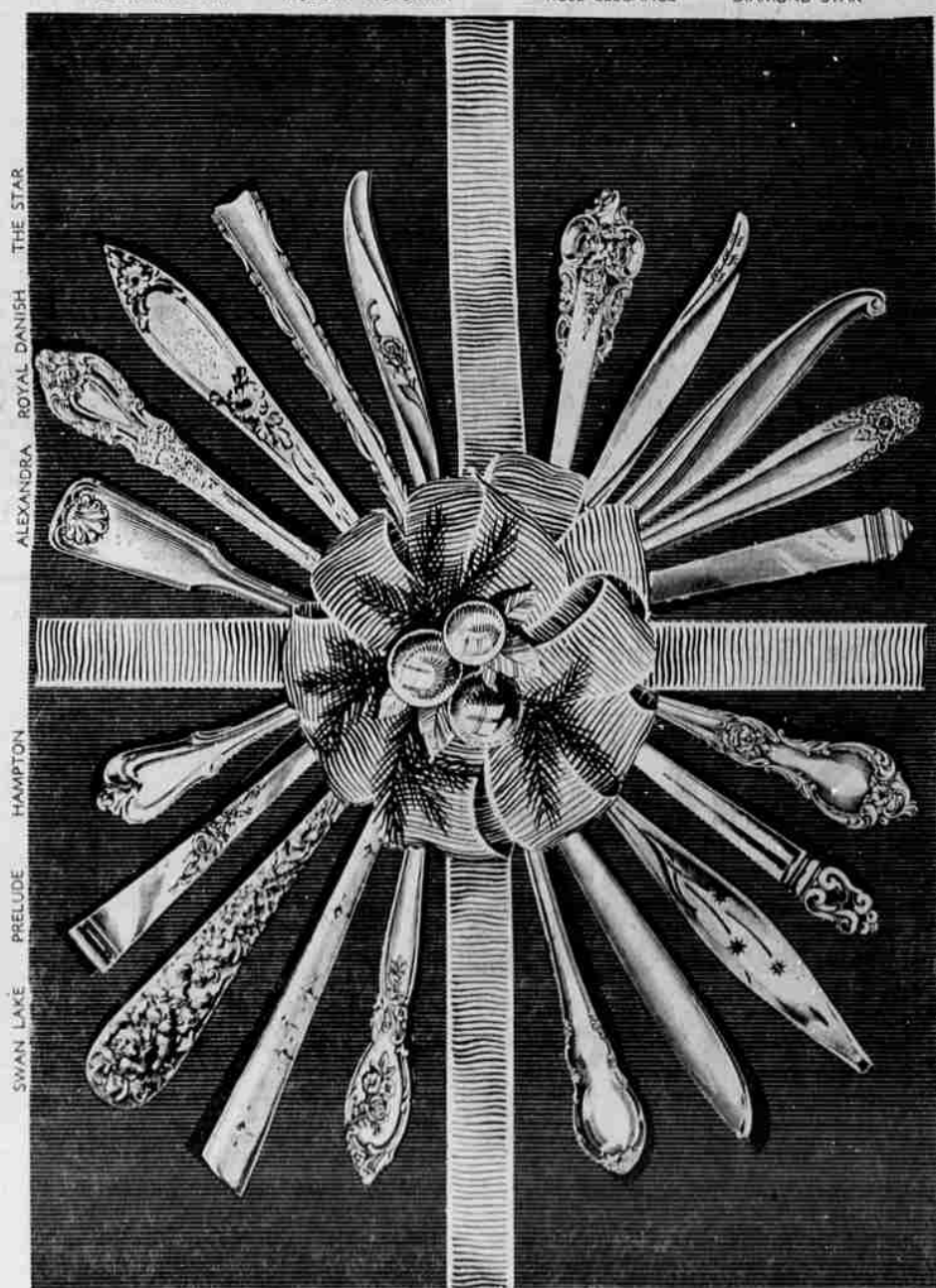
