The TV networks must be getting the holiday spirit, for more bright video packages will be offered this week than have been unwrapped in any week recently.

Leonard Bernstein will conduct a Young People's Concert, actress Bette Davis will be singing and dancing on the Andy Williams show after playing a dramatic role in the "Virginian" stories by F. Scott Fitzgerald and A. J. Cronin will be dramatized on Dick Powell's show and the DuPont show. Lillian Gish will portray a bank-robbing grandmother on the "Defenders," an angry Paladin impresses a town with the true meaning of Christmas, and Lloyd Bridges' 8-year daughter hears angels singing (Mitchell Boys Choir).

Special news features on heredity, hurricanes, precinct politics, the Polaris submarine, a report by President Kennedy, and possibly an international live television broadcast via a communications satellite will be highlights of an informational nature.

CONCERT HALL, 2 p.m. Sunday KSHA radio. Brahms' "Symphony No. 3 in F Major" and "Variations on a Theme by Haydn," Dvorak's "Serenade in D Minor," and Bizet's "Carmen" and "L'Arlesienne Suites."

THREAD OF LIFE, 5 p.m. Sunday KMED-TV. Dr. Frank Baxter is commentator on this Bell System Science Series program which tells the story of human heredity, tracing the development of the science of genetics in relation to plants, to animals and finally to human beings.

TWENTIETH CENTURY, 6 p.m. Sunday KBES-TV. "Army of the Damned." Tells the story of Andrei Andreevich Vlasov, much-decorated Russian general who was feared and hated by both Stalin and Hitler. After his capture by the Germans in World War II, he openly denounced Stalin and called for the overthrow of communism in Russia.

DISNEY'S WONDERFUL WORLD, 7:30 p.m. Sunday KMED-TV. In "Hurricane Hannah" film clips of some of the most destructive hurricanes in U. S. history are combined in a documentary fashion to show how the Navy, Coast Guard and U. S. Weather Bureau cooperate to track a hurricane. Viewers will see the Navy's famed "Hurricane Hunters" fly directly in the eye of the storm.

G.E. TRUE, 9:30 p.m. Sunday KBES-TV. From 1948 until 1957 the FBI looked for

a master Soviet spy known only as "Mark" whom nobody had ever seen.

SHOW OF THE WEEK, 10 p.m. Sunday KMED-TV. "The Ordeal of Dr. Shannon," adapted from A. J. Cronin's novel, "Shannon's Way." Was filmed in Scotland as a co-operative production of NBC and Associated Rediffusion Limited, an English television network. Rod Taylor plays the title role of a brilliant young doctor who gives up a promising medical practice to devote his energies to research.
