N. Y. Publishers, Printers To Meet

New York — The New York Publishers Association and the striking printers union meet Tuesday in their first direct confrontation in almost a week in the 10-day old newspaper strike.

Federal mediators, however, held little hope for a quick settlement of the stalemate which has closed nine metropolitan area newspapers.

Bertram S. Powers, president of Local 67 of the International Typographical Union, issued a cautious statement Sunday in which he insisted that his union was "flexible and willing to negotiate with an open mind."

But Powers dimmed hopes for progress in the bogged-down negotiations "until the publishers do something."

"So far," he said, "they have indicated theirs is a fixed position."

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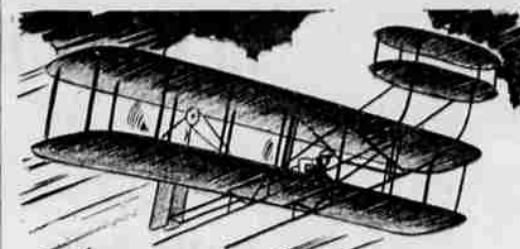

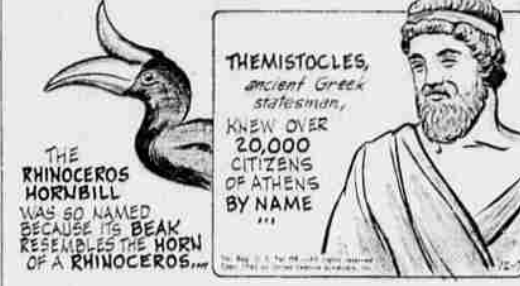
