Christmas Trees For White House Was Pierce Idea

The first White House Christmas tree was introduced by President Pierce in 1856, but the first "National Christmas Tree" did not make its appearance until 1923 when President Coolidge lighted the huge spruce on the White House lawn.

One legend about the origin of Christmas tree tinsel goes like this: Long ago, a poor widow who could not afford ornaments for her children's tree, awoke on Christmas day to find a spider had spun its webs over the tree. Sunlight had turned the webs to silver.

The Scandinavians called their mid-winter festival the "jule" and lighter their jule log and carried it along with a boat's head in honor of their Sun Boat or Sun God. Hence, our word "Yule."

Starting December 17 and continuing for seven days, the ancient Romans feasted and made merry celebrating their Saturnalia in halls and banquet rooms decorated with laurel and greens.
