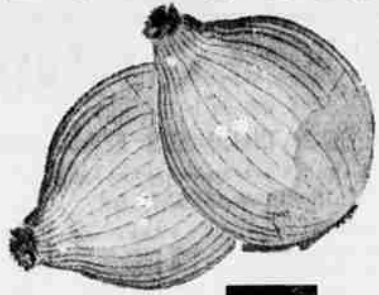

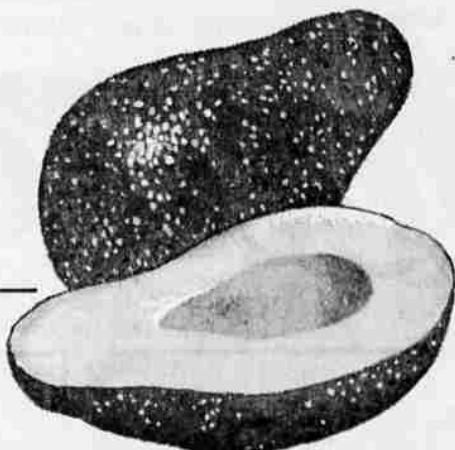

Factor Apparently Heavy Donor to Democratic Party

Washington — (AP) — John (Jake the Barber) Factor, victim of a gangland kidnapping in 1933, and his wife apparently were bipartisan in their contributions to the 1960 presidential campaigns.

The couple gave a total of \$10,000 to the Citizens for Kennedy Organization, according to records of campaign expenditures.

A spokesman for Factor, who was granted a Christmas pardon by President Kennedy on a 1943 mail fraud conviction, indicated in Los Angeles that Factor also contributed to the Republican party.

Not on GOP List

The Republican National Committee said Factor was not on its list of major contributors, but a GOP spokesman did not rule out the possibility that Factor might have contributed \$10 or \$15 in the 1960 campaign.

The newspaper Chicago American said Wednesday that reports filed with Congress after the 1960 election "disclosed that Factor had been one of the largest personal contributors to the Kennedy campaign with \$20,000."

A partial check of records kept by the clerk of the House of Representatives showed that John Factor, 1185 Loma Linda dr., Beverly Hills, Calif., and Bella Factor, 1184 Loma Linda dr., Beverly Hills, contributed \$5,000 each to the Kennedy organization.

Amount Not Recalled
The spokesman for Factor said he "contributed to both parties, but I do not recall how much." The spokesman said Factor had a cold and was not taking telephone calls himself.

The presidential pardon nullified deportation proceedings against Factor, based on the 1943 conviction, started by the U.S. Immigration Service last week.

Factor said he was kidnapped in Chicago by Roger (The Terrible) Touhy, who served 26 years for the crime and was shot to death in 1959 22 days after his release from prison.

The late Federal Judge John P. Barnes once ruled that Factor had faked the kidnapping, but he was overruled by an appeals court.

Ullman Considers Supporting Tax Cut

Washington — (AP) — Rep. Al Ullman (D-Ore.) said Wednesday he would support a tax cut if the present economic trend continues.

But Ullman, a member of the House Ways and Means committee, said he would reach no final decision until further hearings are held by the committee.

The Oregon Democrat said he thought that testimony presented this year before the committee had revealed "a preponderance of evidence" that a tax cut would spur economic growth.

"A tax cut would seem to be justified on the basis of overwhelming evidence that the present tax structure is acting as a drag on the economy," he said.

However, Ullman said, whether such a tax cut ultimately should be made would depend on the state of the economy at the time a tax revision program comes up for a vote.

A speeding up of the economy and possible resumption of an inflationary trend might make a tax cut undesirable, he said.

Mark of Death on Venezuelan Denied

Washington — (AP) — The Venezuelan Embassy Wednesday denied allegations by the wife of former dictator Marcos Perez Jimenez that he would be executed if a U.S. court in Florida extradited him.

The embassy issued a statement saying: "It is absolutely false and without foundation that Perez Jimenez and his relatives would be executed, because in Venezuela there is no death sentence."

Triplets Set Record As First To Enroll

Madison, Wis. — (AP) — Jane Olmstead is a freshman at the University of Wisconsin. So is Janet Olmstead and so is Robert Olmstead. And Herbert Olmstead, a Madison electrician, is paying the bills for all of them.

The Olmstead triplets all enrolled in UW's freshman class this year, the first time the school ever enrolled triplets.

The three, 18 years old, are natives of Fresno, Calif., but they chose their mother's alma mater for their college. Jane is studying nursing, Janet letters and science and Robert engineering.
