Eczema Of Infants: That common disease of infants, eczema, which causes a patch of skin to become red and inflamed, was discussed recently in an article by Dr. S. Robert Lewis of Princeton, N. J. Often it is hard to say what the cause is in a particular case of eczema, even when a pediatrician, a skin specialist and an allergist put their heads together.

Other symptoms which may indicate allergy in children, are discussed in Dr. Alvarez's booklet, "Allergy, Hay Fever and Asthma."
