Contrary to what my sister-in-law says, I feel I did the right thing.

It seems to me there are certain proprieties my sister-in-law should adhere to during this period which is so sad for the family. How can she sit down and ask everybody to be happy? A recently bereaved widow isn't expected to be spreading joy around.

But Marian just went ahead and mailed her pack of envelopes as usual. One family so much as told her in plain English that it was a heartless thing to do, especially since they had lost their mother in August.

She should have more respect for the mood of a mourner in Christmas or not.
