Patents Obtained By Local Woman

Patents from the United States, Canada and Japan have been obtained by Mrs. Rose Breeze, 921 Murray st., Medford, for an applicator which she invented for use in the application of chemical solution for permanent waves or hair dye.

Mrs. Breeze first had the idea for the invention about 13 years ago while giving a home permanent to a young daughter. Noting how the liquid chemical would "run," and irritate the sensitive skin of the child's face, neck and scalp, she conceived the idea of an applicator which would apply the chemical directly to the hair without superfluous liquid.

After designing her invention, Mrs. Breeze has spent the past seven years obtaining her patents. The first, which she obtained in this country, took five years. Upon receipt of it she applied for the Canadian and the Japanese patents which arrived within two years from each country.

Now Mrs. Breeze is attempting to interest other persons in organizing a firm with her in the valley for the actual production and marketing of the invention. She has lived in Medford with her family for the past 19 years.
